Translation and Creation

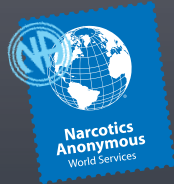
We publish NA Literature in 57 languages—and counting! The Basic Text is in 39 languages so far.



Translations are locally driven. We help ensure the conceptual fidelity of our message and protect the independence of local NA communities from individuals and organizations outside NA.

NA literature is written by and for members. Literature creation and updates are always driven by Fellowship priorities. Surveys, focus groups, workgroups, review and input, workshops, and events involve as many members as possible to make our worldwide experience, strength, and hope available now and in the future.

Public Relations and H&I



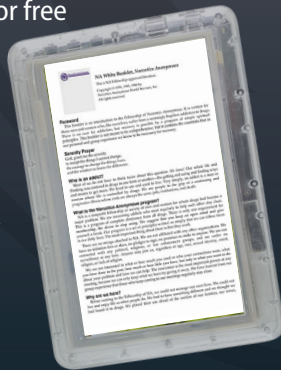
We work to ensure that NA has universal recognition and respect as a viable program of recovery, seeing to NA's legal registration where required and maintaining relationships with government officials and professionals.

We work with local members and corrections officials to make NA literature available for free on tablets for those incarcerated.

We are continually developing resources—including a new PR video explaining what NA is, how it works, and how to contact us.

Through workshops, webinars, work with local committees and direct correspondence, we have helped to grow Inmate Step Writing and Sponsorship Behind the Walls.

We also publish and post *Reaching Out*, a quarterly newsletter to help incarcerated addicts connect to the NA program of recovery. We send copies for free to addicts "on the inside."



Gathering and Sharing

We gather NA members across geographic and language barriers to share recovery, learn together, and grow Narcotics Anonymous.

We organize and fund the World Service Conference—now hybrid, with a virtual interim meeting and bimonthly webinars. More than 300 people, including Conference participants, World Board members, translators, and support staff come together in person and virtually to



make decisions, plan, and develop communication strategies to inform and involve members. The World Convention of Narcotics Anonymous brings tens of thousands of members together. Thousands more, including many correctional facilities, connect for free through simultaneously translated audio streaming of main meetings.

We connect new and isolated communities with the worldwide Fellowship of NA. Currently, we subsidize and facilitate collaboration among numerous emerging NA communities.

Technology and Information

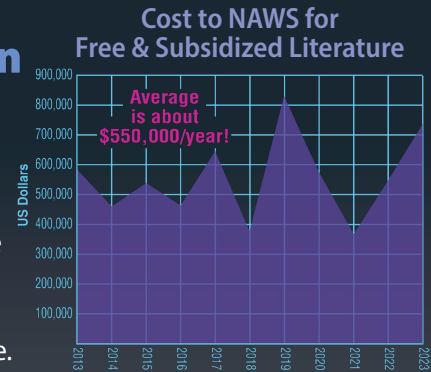
We function as an information hub, answering questions, sharing best practices, and helping to connect people and resources across the fellowship.

We supply free online subscriptions to daily readings and newsletters.

We post events around the world, facts about NA, information and local PR videos on Instagram.

Distribution and Protection

We provide more than half a million dollars, on average, in free and subsidized literature every year to NA communities and members worldwide.



All of NA's booklets and pamphlets, and audio versions of the Basic Text, are posted online for free streaming and download.

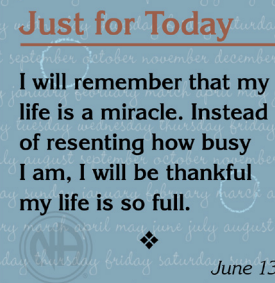
We maintain NA's copyrights and trademarks to ensure the Fellowship's intellectual property is secure and the integrity of our message is uncompromised.
