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

A Note from Your World Board

As the old saying goes, every crisis contains the seeds of opportunity. That has certainly been true for Narcotics Anonymous in the age of COVID-19. NA members found new ways to connect, serve, and contribute even as the world shut down. Our experience with virtual meetings, webinars, group chats, email blasts, and electronic publications allowed us to adapt to pandemic conditions quickly.

This *NAWS Annual Report* for the 2021 fiscal year (1 July 2020 through 30 June 2021) provides an overview of activities carried



out on behalf of the Fellowship and overseen by your World Board. In addition to audited financial statements, a record of contributions, and illuminating charts and graphs that display information in digestible chunks, this report captures many of our accomplishments in this most unusual year. 



In the meantime, the board encourages local service bodies to continue to recognize and embrace virtual meetings.



Staff and Offices

The start of the 2021 fiscal year (FY) marked a low but hopeful point for NA World Services. Almost four months into the pandemic, we were critically understaffed but buoyed by increased contributions and a slight tick-up in literature sales. Some NAWS staff returned to work by the start of July 2020, but many more remained furloughed. This *NAWS Annual Report* for FY 2021 reflects current staffing as we publish in the spring of 2022.



Your World Service Office (WSO)

Narcotics Anonymous World Services in Chatsworth, California, is the central resource hub for NA members, groups, and service bodies worldwide. The executive and administrative staff work with the World Board to carry out Conference-approved projects, coordinate workgroups, and support the World Convention. They communicate with

members and the public through various periodicals, reports, webinars, and emails. The California office also produces and distributes NA literature, protects the Fellowship's copyrights and trademarks, and maintains our website, www.na.org.

Branch Offices

Paul Decock, Tanya B. Matheus, and Benjamin Marechal maintain WSO-Europe. They distribute literature in 35 languages, much of it printed on site. Emerging NA communities in Eastern Europe and Africa receive literature at no cost from WSO-Europe. The office serves

members, groups, and institutions seeking information about NA, and supports the European Delegates Meeting.

Siamak Khajeian manages the Iranian branch of the World Service Office. He and his staff—Mohammad Ahmari, Shahram Chegini, Nemat Hosseini, and Farhad Poorsohi—support NA's fastest-growing community and its 21,974 meetings. WSO-Iran

produces and distributes NA literature in Farsi. They also assist in the translation of documents and support many of the essential services offered by the region.

Distribution Centers

Two distribution centers—one in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada, and the other in Bangalore, India—play a vital role in furthering

our vision. Jacquie Sullivan and Paul Sullivan staff the Mississauga center, serving the literature needs of Canadian NA communities, while Pramila Dias distributes literature in twelve languages throughout South Asia from the Bangalore center.



Shifting our financial model from one that depends on literature sales to a more sustainable model that relies on member contributions has been a long-standing goal for NA World Services. The financial impact of the pandemic made the need for this shift more urgent and pronounced. Members responded by increasing their contributions and stepped up to organize online events to raise funds, set up recurring drafts in record amounts, and honor others with NAWS contributions and e-cards. We are happy to report that member contributions for the 2021 fiscal year represented 25 percent of our income. That's up from 10 percent in the previous fiscal year. We have a long way to go before we are self-supporting through member contributions, but we are on our way. Thank you!

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Income by Source for 2020-2021



 <u>Principle a Day book project</u> on track with multiple rounds of collecting source material and circulating review and input drafts;
- hosting a record six open webinars, featuring the experience of members from Argentina to Indonesia, Nebraska to Nigeria, each simultaneously translated into multiple languages and attended by up to 1,000 people; and
- publishing more than 100 pieces of translated literature, including many newly translated pamphlets and booklets posted at www.na.org/IPs.

We present this annual report in a digital format, as in the previous fiscal year. This saves money and trees while accommodating a more visual approach. 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








Our Multilingual Catalog: Translated Literature and Other Products




Distribution data in charts and graphs for the 2021 fiscal year (FY 2021)


Context is important when considering this data. It reflects the first of two years in which pandemic safety measures constrained our activities. By the start of the fiscal year (1 July 2020), most meetings and events had moved online, and members, groups, and service committees stopped buying keytags and literature.

This year's data is, therefore, most unusual. Though we often compare distribution data over time to assess trends, doing so with this set of data may not be especially helpful or telling.

FY 2021 Basic Text Distributed by Language




Electronic Book Sales 2012–2021

567 non-English downloads






The Basic Text still accounts for the "lion's share" of our book distribution



Informational Pamphlets Distributed in Print FY 2021







Notes to Consolidated Financial Statement

Independent Auditors' Report Years Ended June 2021, 2020, and 2019

NOTE 1 - ORGANIZATION AND NATURE OF ACTIVITIES

Narcotics Anonymous World Services, Inc. (NAWS) was incorporated on January 25, 1977 and is headquartered in Chatsworth, California. In addition, NAWS operates literature distribution facilities in India and Toronto, Canada, and offices in Brussels, Belgium, and Iran. NAWS' Iranian service office is known as Payam Omega. NAWS is a not-for-profit organization that provides communications and information for the Fellowship of Narcotics Anonymous (NA). NAWS achieves its purpose by maintaining correspondence with NA groups and service committees, by printing and distributing World Services Conference (WSC) approved literature, and by maintaining the archives and files of NA.

In 1993, NA established the Fellowship Intellectual Property Trust (the Trust). The Trust was established for the purpose of holding and administering all recovery material and other intellectual properties of NA. The Trust is included in the consolidated financial statements of NAWS as a result of common control.

NAWS is exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and under the California Revenue and Taxation Code. The Trust is also exempt under the applicable Internal Revenue Code and comparable California Revenue and Taxation Code. In addition, the Internal Revenue Service has determined that NAWS and the Trust are not private foundations within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for federal and state income taxes was made for either NAWS or the Trust.

NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

A. Consolidation Policy and Basis of Accounting

The accompanying consolidated financial statements include the accounts of NAWS and the Trust. Significant intercompany balances and transactions are eliminated in consolidation. The consolidated financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

B. Financial Statement Presentation

Under U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) not-for-profit organizations are required to report net assets in two classes: net assets with donor restrictions and net assets without donor restrictions. As of June 30, 2021, 2020 and 2019, NAWS had no net assets with donor restrictions.

C. Cash and Cash Equivalents

NAWS considers short-term investments with initial maturities of 90 days or less held in bank and brokerage accounts to be cash equivalents.

D. Investments

NAWS investments are reported at fair value. Investments include certificates of deposit and government securities. See Note 5.

E. Inventory

Publications and other items held for resale are included in inventory and are carried at the lower of cost or net realizable value. Cost for each item is determined using the weighted average method.

F. Property and Equipment

Leasehold improvements and furniture and equipment are recorded at cost. Major additions are capitalized while replacements, maintenance and repairs that do not improve or extend the useful life of the asset are expensed. Depreciation and amortization are computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the related assets, which are as follows:

Leasehold improvements 5 years Furniture and equipment 5 - 10 years

Depreciation and amortization expense related to property and equipment for the years ended June 30, 2021, 2020, and 2019 amounted to \$191,697, \$200,317 and \$166,350, respectively.

G. Trademarks and Copyrights

The cost of acquiring and defending copyrights and trademarks is capitalized and is amortized over the approximate economic life of the copyright or trademark, which is estimated to be ten years. The cost of computer software is also capitalized and is amortized over a period of seven years. Amortization expense related to trademarks and copyrights for the years ended June 30, 2021, 2020 and 2019 amounted to \$188,730, \$207,568 and \$205,312, respectively.

H. Accounts Receivable and Allowance for Doubtful Accounts

Accounts receivable are reported net of an allowance for doubtful accounts. The allowance is based on management's estimate of the amount of receivables that will actually be collected. Management estimates uncollectible accounts based on the age of the receivable and other factors.

I. Translation of Foreign Financial Statements

Financial operations in Canada, Europe and the Middle East are translated throughout the year to United States dollars. Gains or losses resulting from translating foreign currency financial statements are recorded in the consolidated statements of functional expenses as currency conversion.

I. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

K. Sales of Publications and Program Materials

NAWS generates revenue from sales of publications and program materials. This revenue is recognized at the point in time when goods are shipped to customers.

L. Fellowship Contributions

Unconditional contributions and pledges are recorded when received. Pledges outstanding are subject to an allowance for uncollectible accounts and are discounted to present value when long term in nature. There were no outstanding pledges receivable as of June 30, 2021, 2020 and 2019.

M. Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing NAWS' programs and other activities are reported by both their natural and functional classifications in the statements of functional expenses. Expenditures that can be identified with a specific program or supporting service are allocated directly according to their purpose. Costs that are common to more than one function are allocated among the applicable programs and supporting services based on estimates of employee time, using percentages that represent hours spent or wages, or upon estimates of other resources spent.

N. Tax Status

GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by NAWS and recognize a tax liability if NAWS has taken a tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. NAWS is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

O. Recently Adopted Accounting Pronouncement

In May 2014, the FASB issued ASU 2014-09, Revenue from Contracts with Customers (Topic 606), ("ASC 606"). The underlying principle of ASC 606 is to recognize revenue to depict the transfer of goods or services to customers at the amount expected to be collected. ASC 606 creates a five-step model that requires entities to exercise judgment when considering the terms of contract(s), which include (1) identifying the contract or agreement with a customer/ member, (2) identifying our performance obligations in the contract or agreement, (3) determining the transaction price, (4) allocating the transaction price to the separate performance obligations, and (5) recognizing revenue as each performance obligation is satisfied. NAWS adopted ASC 606 effective July 1, 2021, and adoption of such standard had no effect on previously reported balances.

P. Recently Issued Accounting Pronouncement

In February 2016, the FASB issued ASU No. 2016-02 Leases, requiring organizations to recognize lease assets and lease liabilities on the statement of financial position and requiring disclosure of key information about leasing arrangements. The guidance is effective for periods beginning after December 15, 2021, with early adoption permitted. NAWS is currently evaluating the impact of the pending adoption of this new standard on its financial statements.

NOTE 3 - RETIREMENT PLAN

NAWS maintains a qualified defined contribution retirement plan, which covers all employees. Under the terms of the plan, employees may elect to contribute pre-tax earnings up to the maximum allowable amount under the Internal Revenue Code. NAWS matches deferrals of up to 8% of compensation based on the employee's number of years of service. NAWS contributions totaled \$97,187, \$122,728 and \$133,942 for the years ended June 30, 2021, 2020 and 2019, respectively.

NOTE 4 - COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

NAWS has entered into various lease agreements for the use of office equipment and facilities. The following is a schedule of future minimum rental payments required under leases that have initial or remaining noncancelable lease terms in excess of one year as of June 30, 2021:

NOTE 5 - INVESTMENTS

GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes valuation inputs into three levels based on the extent to which inputs used in measuring fair value are observable in the market:

Level 1 – Inputs are quoted prices in an active market.

Level 2 – Inputs are quoted prices for similar instruments and model-based valuation techniques for which all significant assumptions are observable in the market or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3 – Inputs are generally unobservable and typically reflect management's estimates of assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability.

Level 2 investments consist of government obligations valued based on trade prices for similar securities. Level 3 investments are certificates of deposit reported at cost, which approximates fair value.

NOTE 6 - CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

NAWS places its cash and cash equivalents with high quality financial institutions. Cash in U.S. banks is covered by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000 per bank. Cash in Canadian accounts is insured up to \$100,000 (CAD) per bank. At June 30, 2021, deposits in U.S. institutions exceeded insurance limits by \$1,834,388 and deposits in Canadian banks exceeded insurance limits by \$439,576 (CAD). Cash in European accounts is not covered and totaled approximately \$284,540 (USD) as of June 30, 2021.

Assets reported in the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2021 include cash totaling \$417,853 and publication inventory of \$510,169 at Payam Omega. Due to current relations between Iran and the United States, it is unlikely that NAWS could transfer such assets out of Iran; accordingly their use is limited to Iranian operations.

NOTE 7 - EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT

NAWS has entered into an employment agreement with its Executive Director. The agreement provides for compensation and benefits and expires on December 31, 2021. Should the agreement be terminated by NAWS, certain amounts would be payable to the Executive Director as defined in the agreement. Such amounts have not been accrued as of June 30, 2021.

NOTE 8 - AVAILABILITY OF FINANCIAL ASSETS

As of June 30, 2021, NAWS had \$4,086,005 of financial assets consisting of cash, cash equivalents, and liquid investments available to meet cash needs for general expenditures. None of these financial assets is subject to donor or contractual restrictions that make them unavailable for expenditure within one year of the balance sheet date. NAWS's goal is to maintain cash and liquid investments on hand to meet at least one year's worth of anticipated operating expenses and a policy to structure its financial assets to be available as its general expenditures and liabilities come due.

NOTE 9 - PPP LOAN

On April 21, 2020 and February 19, 2021, NAWS entered into loan agreements with City National Bank in the amount of \$676,740 and 517,150, respectively, under the Paycheck Protection Program ("PPP"). The PPP, established as part of the CARES Act, provides for loans to qualifying businesses

for certain expenses, including payroll costs, continuation of group health care benefits, rent, utilities, and interest on certain other debt obligations. The loans bear interest at a rate of 1.0% per annum and mature April 23, 2022 and February 22, 2026. The loan and accrued interest are forgivable under some circumstances.

NOTE 10 - SBA LOAN

On July 7, 2020, NAWS entered into an agreement with The Small Business Administration for a loan in the amount of \$150,000. The loan bears interest at a rate of 2.75% per annum and matures July 7, 2050, with monthly payments commencing January 1, 2023.

NOTE 11 - RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

On March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization declared the outbreak of a novel coronavirus (COVID-19) a pandemic. The COVID-19 outbreak in the United States has resulted in government-mandated business closures, significantly reduced business activity and disruption in financial markets. At the present time, management is unable to quantify the potential future impact of the pandemic on the organization's operations. Effective July 2020, the board approved changing sales credit terms to go beyond 120 days, extended all current contracted discount levels and special arrangements for pricing through 2021, and extended all current vendor licenses through January 2022.

NOTE 12 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

On October 6, 2021, NAWS received notice the SBA had reviewed the forgiveness application of their first PPP loan and provided forgiveness of their PPP loan in the amount of \$563,362. The remaining balance of \$113,378 remains payable by NAWS.

Management has evaluated subsequent events through March 17, 2022, the date these financial statements were available to be issued. Except as discussed above, there were no material subsequent events that require recognition or additional disclosure in these financial statements.
