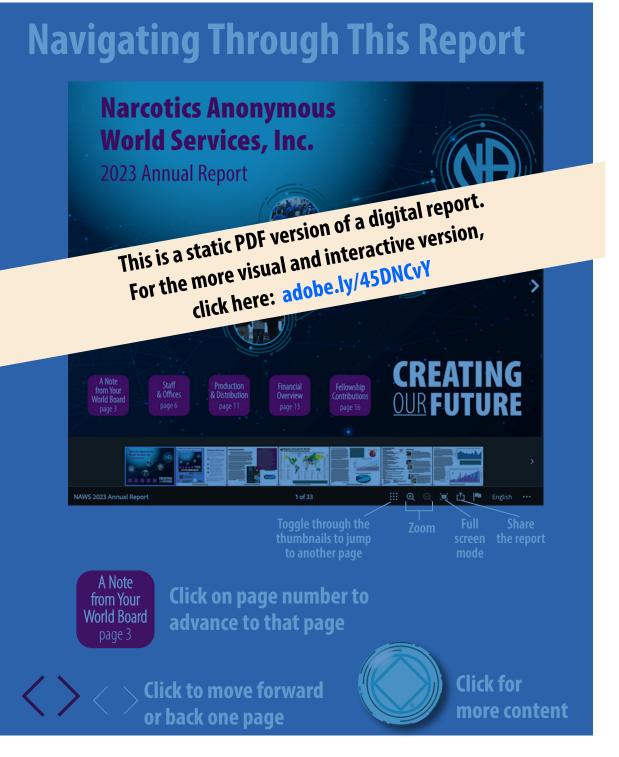

# **A Note from Your World Board**

# "Our gratitude speaks when we care and when we share the NA way."

We are grateful this year to see the Fellowship we serve reviving and rebuilding after so much struggle. During the darkest parts of the pandemic, we discovered our resilience as a Fellowship and found renewed faith in our Second Tradition. We have learned a lot, and changed a lot, as a result of our experience. And the journey continues. We are reminded that change is part of growth, that sometimes destruction allows us to make changes that we couldn't have imagined before—and that we are always beginning, in our recovery and in our growth as an organization.

Every year, we report on our operations. The *Annual Report* allows us to gather in one place information on what we have done, how we have done it, where money has come from, and where it has gone. Every year we report on the growth of the

Fellowship, literature sales and disbursements, the offices and staff, and your contributions. What doesn't always get reflected in these reports is how much love and service these numbers represent: how much we all work together to bring addicts to NA and bring NA to addicts suffering in our own communities and around the world.

In July 2022, the World Board met in person for the first time since March 2020. Board members elected in 2020 finally met their colleagues face to face. There is no substitute for in-person meetings to work and think through challenges together, but the board has learned to do much of its business virtually, and has been able to participate in events around the world through virtual connections. As a result, we are able to economize, expand our reach, increase our communication with each other and with the fellowship—as we optimize our in-person meetings to make the most of our time together. 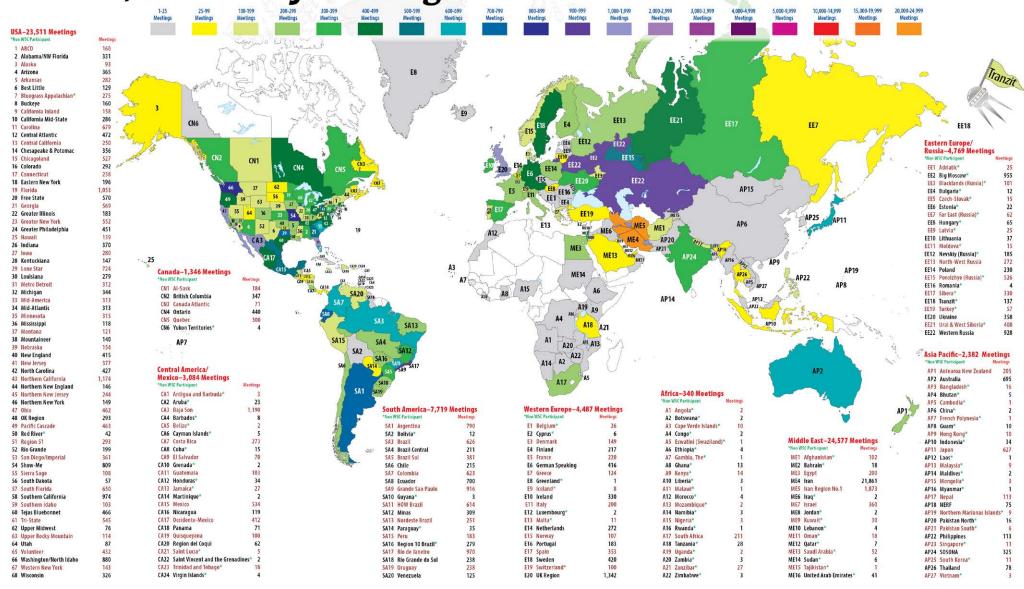

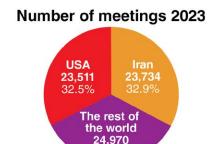
After a forest fire, the first green shoots are not the same plants as the old growth; a whole new ecosystem develops from the ashes. And so it is with World Services: The fiscal year 2022–2023 saw lots of new growth, but things are undeniably different—and in many ways, that will have been a good thing. In fiscal year (FY) 2022–23, meetings that had been shut down during the pandemic re-opened and started to fill again; service bodies have come back from dormancy; and members all over the world are working every day to ensure that Narcotics Anonymous can come back better, stronger, and more creative than ever.

The new green shoots are exciting: In this fiscal year, NAWS has gone mostly paperless, relying on electronic publications for most of our communications. We continue to do more with fewer people than we thought possible. We began upgrading our data hardware for the first time in years, and we began an ongoing effort to hire new staff after the painful furloughs and layoffs the pandemic required. And again, the new growth is not the same: We are re-thinking and updating our approach to databases, from accounting to the meeting finder, to increase efficiency and decrease reliance on human resources.

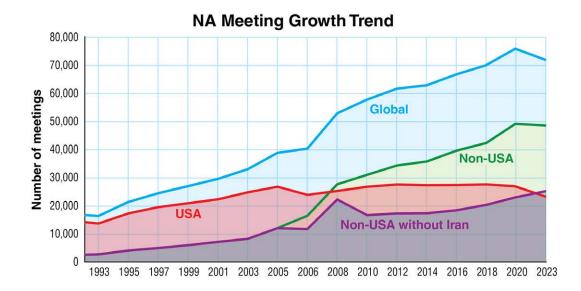
By the middle of the fiscal year, we were selling literature at a rate 34% over our projected budget. A 58% increase in cost of goods has offset the income from literature sales and reminds us that direct contributions are the most reliable and consistent way we can fund world services. The shutdown brought new awareness to the Fellowship of the literature available online, and informational pamphlet (IP) sales are not recovering as quickly as other products. People are reading and sharing those free online resources at ever-greater rates—and we're glad to see it. Even so, income from literature sales was 35% ahead of budget projections: New growth brings new hope. The literature inventory is being increased beyond our pre-pandemic levels to create a cushion against disruptions in the supply chain, and the new growth is being nurtured by our ongoing investment in our vision.

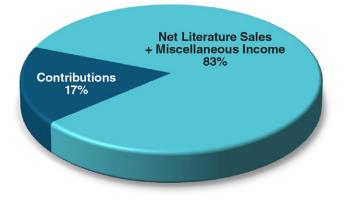

# **Staff and Offices**



### Your World Service Office (WSO)

Narcotics Anonymous World Services in Chatsworth, California, is the central resource hub for NA members, groups, and service bodies worldwide. The executive and administrative staff work with the World Board to carry out conference-approved projects, coordinate workgroups, and support the World Convention. They communicate with members

and the public through various periodicals, reports, webinars, and emails. The California office also produces and distributes NA literature, protects the Fellowship's copyrights and trademarks, and maintains our website, <a href="https://www.na.org">www.na.org</a>.

### **Branch Offices**



WSO-Europe distributes literature in 35 languages, including no-cost literature shipments to emerging NA communities in Eastern Europe and elsewhere. The office serves members, groups, and institutions seeking information about NA, and supports the European Delegates Meeting.

Currently, WSO-E is undergoing some staffing changes, and NAWS is in conversation as to how we can achieve sustainability without diminishing the quality of the services we provide to the groups we reach best via satellite offices. We will keep you posted as we move forward.

Siamak Khajeian manages the Iranian branch of the World Service Office. He and his staff—Mohammad Ahmari, Shahram Chegini, Nemat Hosseini, Farhad Poorsohi, and Saeed Khosravi—support NA's

largest community and its 20,000+ meetings. WSO-Iran produces and distributes NA literature in Farsi. They also assist in the translation of documents and support many of the essential services offered by the region.

### **Distribution Centers**



Two distribution centers—one in Mississauga, Ontario, Canada, and the other in Bangalore, India—play vital roles in furthering our vision. Pramila Dias distributes literature in twelve languages

throughout South Asia from the Bangalore center. The Mississauga center serves the literature needs of Canadian NA communities. Paul and Jacquie Sullivan have recently retired from their posts in Canada. We wish them health and happiness. Brian and Ilda Sullivan (Paul and Jacquie's children) have stepped in to staff the center on an interim basis.

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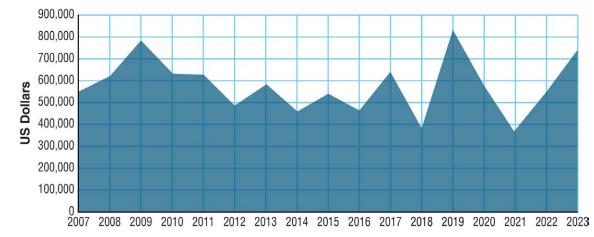
Fellowship development is back on the increase, as well. FY 2022–23 found us 12% over budget in FD for the best reason: a 45% increase in developmental literature. We were able to provide \$738,826 in free and subsidized literature—a 35% increase from 2022. We are so proud that even in this time of financial challenge, NA World Services was able to give close to three quarters of a million dollars in free and subsidized literature to NA communities and to members in institutions.

We have been talking about direct contributions in one way or another since 1984, but beginning in 2020, members, groups, and service bodies stepped up to make contributions and help shift our model from one dependent on lit sales to one based on contributions. As groups returned to meeting in person, we saw literature sales increase, and direct contributions decrease. This is not surprising: As local communities resume service, resources that had been passed directly to NAWS are again needed at the local level. But we can see the momentum building. Now more than ever, we are calling on established members to consider making regular donations part of their Twelfth Step, so we can ground our efforts in a consistent, steady fund flow.

We were happy to publish the *Spiritual Principle a Day* book during the 2022–2023 fiscal year, after a supplyrelated delay. *SPAD* was the first booklength piece created almost entirely through virtual workgroup meetings. The result is enriching the recovery of many members every day. In the previous fiscal year, free email subscriptions for the *Spiritual Principle a Day* had launched together with the *Just for Today* reading, well before the book itself was available. This seems to have generated additional excitement about the book when it went on sale in September 2022.

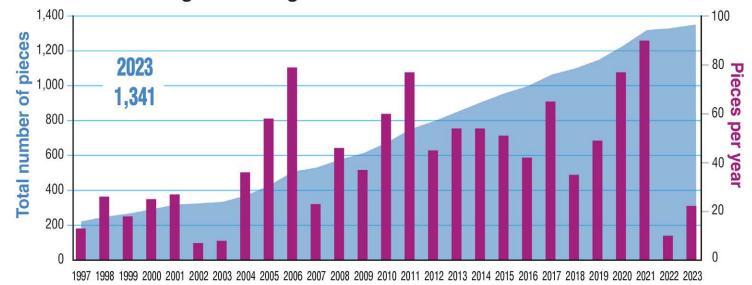
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# Cost to NAWS for Free & Subsidized Literature, 2007–2023

# **Our Multilingual Catalog: Translated Literature and Other Products**



At the end of the fiscal year, we began an expensive, complex undertaking that will bear fruit for many seasons to come: We began updating our databases, our servers, and—in the coming fiscal year—our websites. This investment in hardware, software, and tech strategy has been a long time coming. (Our hardware was very old, and we've been keeping it running with hard work and ingenuity—but eventually that becomes a losing battle.) Investing in the databases, software, and hardware we need will allow us to run more securely, more reliably, and faster. Did you know that na.org fields over 400,000 emails a year? That includes everything from inquiries on how to start a meeting to pernicious spam. Managing so much information and communication takes a lot of hardware and a lot of attention. In June, our online store closed for two weeks as we mounted a massive installation, replacing 25-year-old software with shiny new, functional stuff. The results have been immediately felt in the important, invisible "back end." We plan, over the course of the next several years, a steady rolling out of improvements on the front end—where members will see and feel the difference in our web presence, app, portals, and the store. # **Actual Expenses for FY 2023**

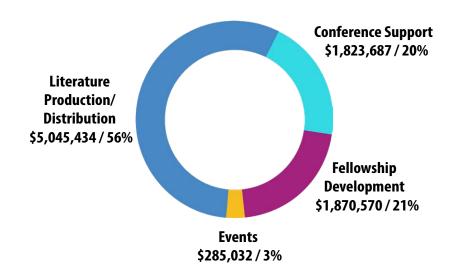

Some other highlights this fiscal year include:

- Audio Basic Texts were released in Brazilian Portuguese and Canadian French. (Find all eleven languages for streaming or download here: <a href="www.na.org/audio.">www.na.org/audio.</a>)
- IP #1 was posted online in American Sign Language. (ASL IP #1 video and other ASL resources can be found here: <a href="www.na.org/asl">www.na.org/asl</a>.)
- The Service Basics and Handbooks on www.na.org were reorganized to be more user-friendly and easier to find (<a href="https://www.na.org/basics">www.na.org/basics</a> and <a href="https://www.na.org/handbooks">www.na.org/handbooks</a>).

We are celebrating the return of *Reaching Out*, the periodical publication for incarcerated members. It is available both on paper and virtually, and is beginning to be available on tablets in some facilities in the US. *Reaching Out* has been a lifeline and an important tool in carrying the message behind the walls.

Virtual Meeting Basics (<a href="www.na.org/virtual">www.na.org/virtual</a>) launched online as World Board-approved service material and provided much-needed help and support to our burgeoning online communities. The 2023 WSC voted to recognize virtual groups, and we welcomed the thriving online community into our service system.

Although staffing is still well below pre-pandemic levels, we are very grateful to have begun rehiring. We are still pushing hard, but there is a freshness and optimism in every department as we see capacity returning. We, the Board, would like to thank everyone who serves the Fellowship, keeping the doors open for those yet to come. We would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to the staff at NA World Services, whose tireless work is helping to make our collective Vision a reality.

Webinars continue to be well-attended and useful, bringing together NA members from across the world to share and care the NA way. In July, we had an open webinar on Fellowship development in English, Farsi, French, Polish, Portuguese, Russian, and Spanish. We celebrated Sponsorship Day together online, and the Unity Day Webinar on 3 September had over 1,000 connections on Zoom and YouTube—many of them at events, meaning even more members were able to participate. Conference participants also took part in regularly scheduled webinars (five this year), which improve communication and allow unprecedented collaboration between regions, zones, and the World Board. Again—from the depths of the pandemic, we have learned to use and optimize tools that improve our ability to communicate, collaborate, and carry the message. We are not "coming back" to where we were, but moving ahead to a new place in our development as a Fellowship.

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# **World Service Conference**

In 2023, the World Service Conference held its first truly hybrid WSC! While many of us were able to gather in person, almost 40 participants joined us virtually, and the Fellowship at large was able to listen live as well. Thanks to our staff and co-facilitators, the process was mostly smooth and very effective.

Remarkably in a year of scarce resources, the *Conference Agenda Report (CAR)* posted early, with video and PowerPoint summaries available online to help members understand and vote their conscience on the issues. The *CAR*, the Conference Approval Track (CAT), *Conference Report*, and supplemental materials were also made available virtually. The conference participant portal, electronic polling, and regular conference participant webinars improved communication and reduced costs. We are very grateful that 46 communities fully or partially funded their participation. The technology required for a hybrid WSC is expensive, and all the costs to hold the conference—travel, meeting space, A/V, and other services—have risen dramatically in recent years, more than offsetting any savings from self-funding and non-travelling participants. The conference determined that, in the future, all regions ought to self-fund if they are able; funding will be available upon request, but the conference is seeking sustainability in part by returning the responsibility of funding delegates to their regions and zones.

The shutdown has afforded us an opportunity to move forward with ideas and plans that have seemed for many years too bold or too difficult for us to try. In this cycle, the conference is innovating in our practices and in our thinking, voting to

- try a three-year cycle with a mid-cycle virtual meeting, until 2029.
- reboot its strategic planning initiatives, moving toward a more collaborative and coherent decision-making process.
- the *Fellowship Intellectual Property Trust* was revised for the first time. Zonal delegates are now recognized in the *FIPT* as decision makers, and the definition of recovery literature has been clarified. The *FIPT* Operational Rules and Use Policy were also revised.

Also at the conference, NAWS Executive Director Anthony Edmondson announced his retirement at the end of his contract in 2025. We are grateful for all Anthony has done for Narcotics Anonymous over the last four decades. Anthony has been a wise and selfless leader, and has set an example of ethical, forthright, and caring service. Without his clear-eyed, careful planning, we might not have made it through this challenging time. Over the course of this conference cycle, we look forward to Anthony leading us through World Convention of NA (WCNA) 38 in Washington, DC—and a smooth and well-crafted transition to our next phase in Narcotics Anonymous World Services.

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# Distribution data in charts and graphs for the 2023 fiscal year (FY 2023)

Context is important when considering the following data. Production is back on the upswing, but it is coming back from the abnormally low numbers that were consequent to the pandemic shutdown.

So, even though the numbers are once again moving in the right direction, the disruption still bears on the figures and stymies the kind of trendline analysis we are accustomed to. It will take a few years before this new growth develops into a steady, predictable pattern once more.

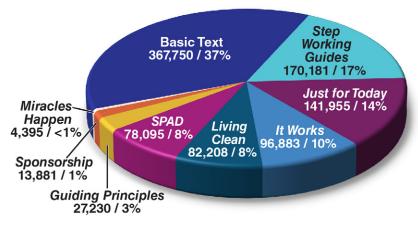

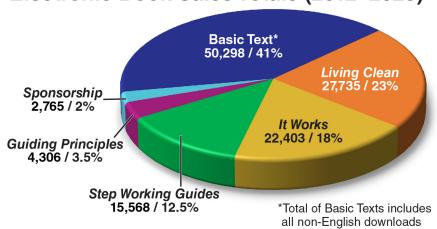
# **FY 2023 Book Distribution**



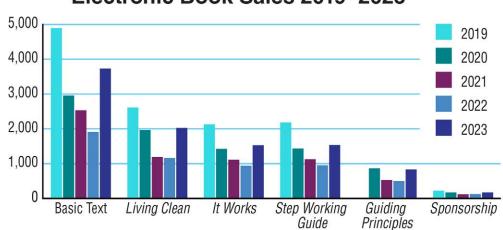
# Basic Text Distributed by Language FY 2023

# Electronic Book Sales 2019-2023

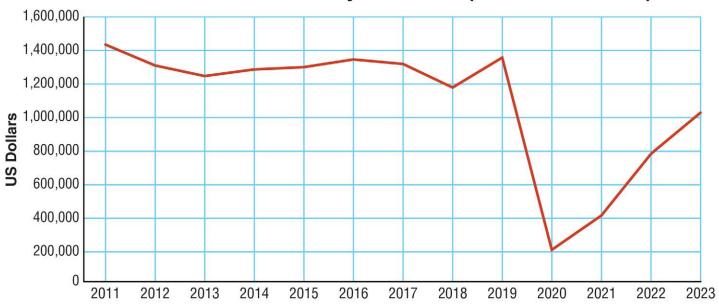


Although NA World Services has posted free electronic versions of IPs and booklets at <a href="www.na.org/ips">www.na.org/ips</a> since 2005, many NA members first became aware of this service in 2020, when in-person meetings around the world closed down. Translated IPs, booklets, and audio versions of the Basic Text are added as they become available.

This tilt toward accessing NA literature in these free online formats has been transformative in how the NA message is carried. But it has had an effect on literature sales.

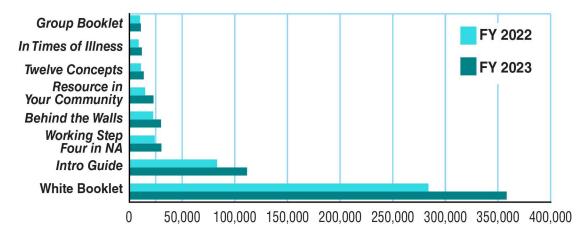

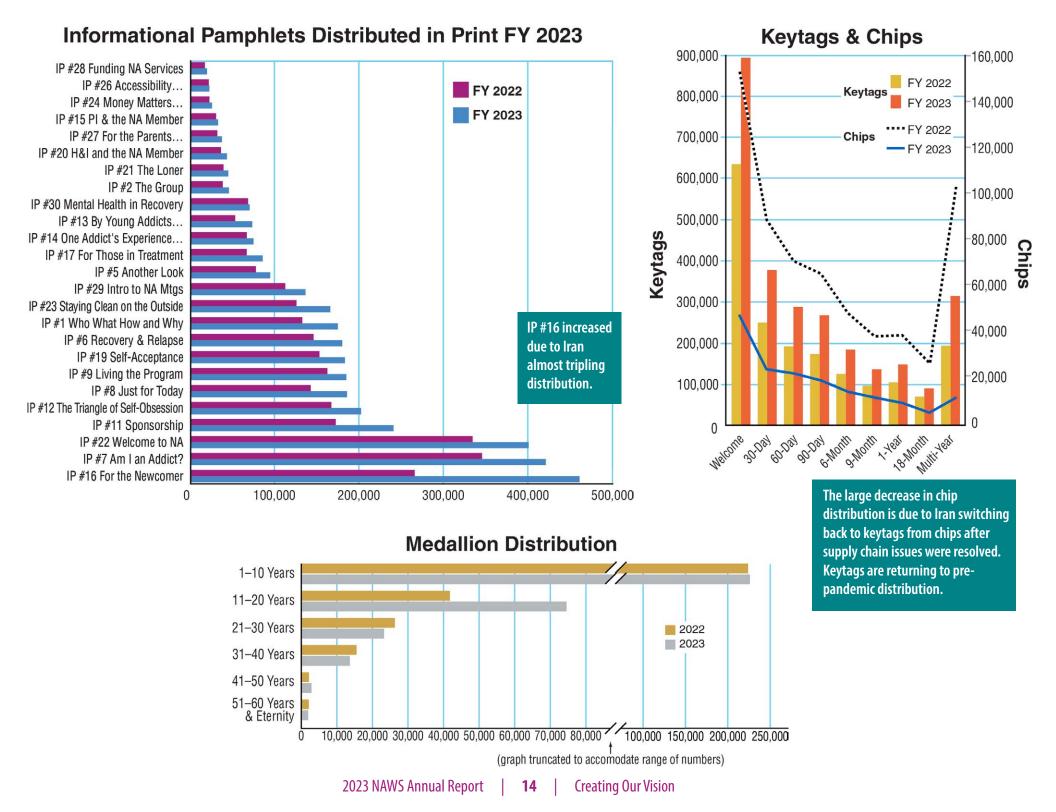
# Income from Other Recovery Literature (IPs and Booklets)

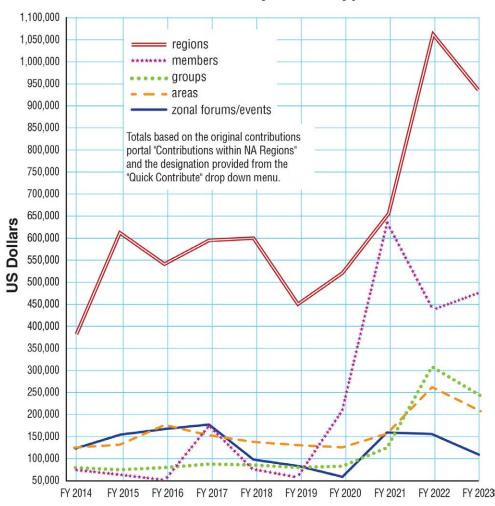

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### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the World Board of Narcotics Anonymous World Services, Inc.

### Opinion

We have audited the accompanying combined consolidated financial statements of Narcotics Anonymous World Services, Inc. (a nonprofit organization) (NAWS), which comprise the consolidated statement of financial position as of June 30, 2023 and the related consolidated statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the consolidated financial statements.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the consolidated financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of NAWS as of June 30, 2023 and the related consolidated statements of activities, functional expenses, and cash flows for the year then ended in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

### **Basis for Qualified Opinion**

We did not audit the financial statement balances and activity related to the Iranian service office, Payam Omega as of and for the year ended June 30, 2023, which statements reflect total assets of \$3,729,873 as of June 30, 2023, and net revenues of \$1,202,461 for the year then ended. Those financial statements were presented in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the Islamic Republic of Iran and audited by other auditors in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the Islamic Republic of Iran, whose report has been furnished to us. Consequently, we were unable to determine whether any adjustments to those amounts were necessary in order for the financial statement balances and activity to conform with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are required to be independent of the NAWS and to meet our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the relevant ethical requirements relating to our audit. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our qualified audit opinion.

### **Emphasis of Matter - Restatement of Beginning Net Assets**

No audit procedures were performed on the financial statement balances or activities of Iranian service office, Payam Omega for the period 2019 through 2022 due to declining relations between Iran and the United States of America. During the year ended June 30, 2023, NAWS was able to obtain an independent audit for Payam Omega, resulting in a change to its net assets as of July 1, 2022 of \$300,505. See Note 11 in the notes to consolidated financial statement for details.

### Responsibilities of Management for the Consolidated Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the combined consolidated financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America, and for the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of combined consolidated financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the combined consolidated financial statements, management is required to evaluate whether there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the NAWS' ability to continue as a going concern within one year after the date that the combined consolidated financial statements are available to be issued

### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Statements

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the combined consolidated financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. Reasonable assurance is a high level of assurance but is not absolute assurance and therefore is not a guarantee that an audit conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards will always detect a material misstatement when it exists. The risk of not detecting a material misstatement resulting from fraud is higher than for one resulting from error, as fraud may involve collusion, forgery, intentional omissions, misrepresentations, or the override of internal control. Misstatements are considered material if there is a substantial likelihood that, individually or in the aggregate, they would influence the judgment made by a reasonable user based on the combined consolidated financial statements.

In performing an audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, we:

- Exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit.
- Identify and assess the risks of material misstatement of the combined consolidated financial statements, whether due to fraud or error, and design and perform audit procedures responsive to those risks. Such procedures include examining, on a test basis, evidence regarding the amounts and disclosures in the combined consolidated financial statements.
- Obtain an understanding of internal control relevant to the audit in order to design audit procedures
  that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the
  effectiveness of the NAWS' internal control. Accordingly, no such opinion is expressed.
- Evaluate the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of significant
  accounting estimates made by management, as well as evaluate the overall presentation of the
  combined financial statements.
- Conclude whether, in our judgment, there are conditions or events, considered in the aggregate, that raise substantial doubt about the NAWS' ability to continue as a going concern for a reasonable period of time.

We are required to communicate with those charged with governance regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit, significant audit findings, and certain internal control related matters that we identified during the audit.

The audit team spends about a week in the Chatsworth office after the close of each fiscal year, during which they perform transaction tests, inspect internal controls, and scrutinize internal financial practices. This professional audit of NAWS' financial reports and practices conforms to best practices in the world of accounting and complies with the legal requirements for nonprofits. To audit the financial activities of WSO Iran, we have to hire an accounting firm in Iran that provides its audit to our US-based auditors. While this makes for an exceedingly slow process, it ensures management and the board have verified figures for all branch offices.

### **Notes to Consolidated Financial Statement**

Independent Auditors' Report Year Ended June 2023

### NOTE 1 - ORGANIZATION AND NATURE OF ACTIVITIES

Narcotics Anonymous World Services, Inc. (NAWS) was incorporated on January 25, 1977 and is headquartered in Chatsworth, California. In addition, NAWS operates literature distribution facilities in India and Toronto, Canada, and offices in Brussels, Belgium, and Iran. NAWS' Iranian service office is known as Payam Omega. NAWS is a not-for-profit organization that provides communications and information for the Fellowship of Narcotics Anonymous (NA). NAWS achieves its purpose by maintaining correspondence with NA groups and service committees, by printing and distributing World Services Conference (WSC) approved literature, and by maintaining the archives and files of NA.

In 1993, NA established the Fellowship Intellectual Property Trust (the Trust). The Trust was established for the purpose of holding and administering all recovery material and other intellectual properties of NA. The Trust is included in the consolidated financial statements of NAWS as a result of common control.

NAWS is exempt from income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and under the California Revenue and Taxation Code. The Trust is also exempt under the applicable Internal Revenue Code and comparable California Revenue and Taxation Code. In addition, the Internal Revenue Service has determined that NAWS and the Trust are not private foundations within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. Therefore, no provision for federal and state income taxes was made for either NAWS or the Trust.

### NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### A. Consolidation Policy and Basis of Accounting

The accompanying consolidated financial statements include the accounts of NAWS and the Trust. Significant intercompany balances and transactions are eliminated in consolidation. The consolidated financial statements are prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

### **B.** Financial Statement Presentation

Under U.S. generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) not-for-profit organizations are required to report net assets in two classes: net assets with donor restrictions and net assets without donor restrictions. As of June 30, 2023, NAWS had no net assets with donor restrictions.

### C. Cash and Cash Equivalents

NAWS considers short-term investments with initial maturities of 90 days or less held in bank and brokerage accounts to be cash equivalents.

### D. Investments

NAWS investments are reported at fair value. Investments include certificates of deposit. See Note 5.

### E. Inventory

Publications and other items held for resale are included in inventory and are carried at the lower of cost or net realizable value. Cost for each item is determined using the weighted average method.

### F. Property and Equipment

Leasehold improvements and furniture and equipment are recorded at cost. Major additions are capitalized while replacements, maintenance and repairs that do not improve or extend the useful life of the asset are expensed. Depreciation and amortization are computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the related assets, which are as follows:

Leasehold improvements 5 years Furniture and equipment 5 - 10 years

Depreciation and amortization expense related to property and equipment for the year ended June 30, 2023 amounted to \$41,784.

### G. Trademarks and Copyrights

The cost of acquiring and defending copyrights and trademarks is capitalized and is amortized over the approximate economic life of the copyright or trademark, which is estimated to be ten years. The cost of computer software is also capitalized and is amortized over a period of seven years. Amortization expense related to trademarks and copyrights for the year ended June 30, 2023, amounted to \$177,473.

### H. Accounts Receivable and Allowance for Doubtful Accounts

Accounts receivable are reported net of an allowance for doubtful accounts. The allowance is based on management's estimate of the amount of receivables that will actually be collected. Management estimates uncollectible accounts based on the age of the receivable and other factors.

### I. Translation of Foreign Financial Statements

Financial operations in Canada, Europe and the Middle East are translated throughout the year to United States dollars. Gains or losses resulting from translating foreign currency financial statements are recorded in the consolidated statements of functional expenses as currency conversion.

### J. Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

### K. Sales of Publications and Program Materials

NAWS generates revenue from sales of publications and program materials. This revenue is recognized at the point in time when goods are shipped to customers.

### L. Fellowship Contributions

Unconditional contributions and pledges are recorded when received. Pledges outstanding are subject to an allowance for uncollectible accounts and are discounted to present value when long term in nature. There were no outstanding pledges receivable as of June 30, 2023.

### M. Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing NAWS' programs and other activities are reported by both their natural and functional classifications in the statements of functional expenses. Expenditures that can be identified with a specific program or supporting service are allocated directly according to their purpose. Costs that are common to more than one function are allocated among the applicable programs and supporting services based on estimates of employee time, using percentages that represent hours spent or wages, or upon estimates of other resources spent.

### N. Tax Status

GAAP requires management to evaluate tax positions taken by NAWS and recognize a tax liability if NAWS has taken a tax position that more likely than not would not be sustained upon examination by a tax authority. NAWS is subject to routine audits by taxing jurisdictions; however, there are currently no audits for any tax periods in progress.

### O. Adoption of New Accounting Policies

In February 2016, the FASB issued ASU No. 2016-02 *Leases*, requiring organizations to recognize lease assets and lease liabilities on the statement of financial position and requiring disclosure of key information about leasing arrangements. The guidance is effective for periods beginning after December 15, 2021, with early adoption permitted. NAWS adopted this standard on July 1, 2022 and implementation resulted in right-of-use assets, net of accumulated amortization of \$1,516,462 and lease obligations of \$1,531,171 in the statement of financial position at June 30, 2023.

### **NOTE 3 - RETIREMENT PLAN**

NAWS maintains a qualified defined contribution retirement plan, which covers all employees. Under the terms of the plan, employees may elect to contribute pre-tax earnings up to the maximum allowable amount under the Internal Revenue Code. NAWS matches deferrals of up to 8% of compensation based on the employee's number of years of service. NAWS' contributions totaled \$113,371 for the year ended June 30, 2023.

### NOTE 4 - COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

On July 1, 2022, NAWS adopted ASU 2016-02 Leases, requiring a lessee to record a right-of-use asset and a corresponding lease liability at the inception of the lease, initially measured at the present value of total lease payments. NAWS classified its five long-term leases as operating leases and determined that the fair value of its operating leases at the inception of the leases totaled \$2,152,472 using discount rates between 2.84% and 3.96%. The operating leases had a weighted average term of 39 months on the date of adoption. As of June 30, 2023, the lease liability was \$1,531,171, of which \$721,129 was current and \$810,042 was non-current. ASU 2016-02 requires recognition in the statements of activities of a single lease cost, calculated so that the cost of the leases are allocated over the lease term, generally on a straight-line basis. Rent expense for the year ended June 30, 2023 was \$656,751. During the year ended June 30, 2023, NAWS reflected amortization of right-of-use asset of \$636,010 related to the leases, resulting in a right-of-use asset, net balance of \$1,516,462 as of June 30, 2023.

### **NOTE 5 - INVESTMENTS**

GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes valuation inputs into three levels based on the extent to which inputs used in measuring fair value are observable in the market:

Level 1 – Inputs are quoted prices in an active market.

Level 2 – Inputs are quoted prices for similar instruments and model-based valuation techniques for which all significant assumptions are observable in the market or can be corroborated by observable market data.

Level 3 – Inputs are generally unobservable and typically reflect management's estimates of assumptions that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability.

### NOTE 6 - CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

NAWS places its cash and cash equivalents with high quality financial institutions. Cash in U.S. banks is covered by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) up to \$250,000 per bank. Cash in Canadian accounts is insured up to \$100,000 (CAD) per bank. At June 30, 2023, deposits in U.S. institutions exceeded insurance limits by \$3,031,083 and deposits in Canadian banks exceeded insurance limits by \$1,007,373 (CAD). Cash in European accounts is not covered and totaled approximately \$132,224 (USD) as of June 30, 2023.

Assets reported in the statement of financial position as of June 30, 2023 include cash totaling \$582,605 and publication inventory of \$3,132,319 at Payam Omega. Due to current relations between Iran and the United States, it is unlikely that NAWS could transfer such assets out of Iran; accordingly their use is limited to Iranian operations.

### **NOTE 7 - EMPLOYMENT CONTRACT**

NAWS has entered into an employment agreement with its Executive Director. The agreement provides for compensation and benefits and expires on December 31, 2024. Should the agreement be terminated by NAWS, certain amounts would be payable to the Executive Director as defined in the agreement. Such amounts have not been accrued as of June 30, 2023.

### **NOTE 8 - AVAILABILITY OF FINANCIAL ASSETS**

As of June 30, 2023, NAWS had \$5,801,828 of financial assets consisting of cash, cash equivalents, and liquid investments available to meet cash needs for general expenditures. None of these financial assets is subject to donor or contractual restrictions that make them unavailable for expenditure within one year of the balance sheet date. NAWS' goal is to maintain cash and liquid investments on hand to meet at least one year's worth of anticipated operating expenses and a policy to structure its financial assets to be available as its general expenditures and liabilities come due.

### **NOTE 9 - PPP LOAN**

On February 19, 2021, NAWS entered into a loan agreement with City National Bank in the amount of \$517,150, under the Paycheck Protection Program ("PPP"). The PPP, established as part of the CARES Act, provides for loans to qualifying businesses for certain expenses, including payroll costs, continuation of group health care benefits, rent, utilities, and interest on certain other debt obligations. The loan bears interest at a rate of 1.0% per annum and matures February 22, 2026. The loan and accrued interest are forgivable under some circumstances.

On September 8, 2022, NAWS received notice the SBA had reviewed the forgiveness application of their second PPP loan and provided forgiveness of their PPP loan in the amount of \$517,150.

### NOTE 10 - SBA LOAN

On July 7, 2020, NAWS entered into an agreement with The Small Business Administration (SBA) for a loan in the amount of \$150,000. The loan bears interest at a rate of 2.75% per annum and matures July 7, 2050, with monthly payments commencing January 1, 2023. On December 4, 2023, NAWS paid off its remaining balance due to the SBA.

### NOTE 11 - IRANIAN SERVICE OFFICE RESTATEMENT

The Iranian service office, Payam Omega's financial statement balances and activity was audited for the year ended June 30, 2023. Prior to this audit, no audits of Payam Omega had been performed since June 30, 2018. The audit for the year ended June 30, 2023 resulted in a change in its beginning net assets of \$300,505.

### **NOTE 12 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS**

Management has evaluated subsequent events through May 24, 2024, the date these financial statements were available to be issued. Except as discussed in Note 10, there were no material subsequent events that require recognition or additional disclosure in these financial statements.
