Yes, We have established a plan to hold two to three service forums per year, consisting of two-day workshops based on the needs of the requesting departments. We also conduct half-day virtual service forums, also offering workshops tailored to departmental needs. In the 2025/2026 cycle, we are implementing a project based on a mapping exercise we conducted across the Argentine region. This mapping exercise

identified areas where our meetings are not reaching, and this project aims to determine how to reach those areas. This project is currently underway.

Describe what kind of planning your region and/or its areas utilize.

We have just presented this two-year project, which begins at our next assembly in March 2026: 1. RATIONALE The Argentine Region of Narcotics Anonymous recognizes the need to strengthen its unity, improve clarity in structural communication, and consolidate the effectiveness of its service, in accordance with its primary purpose: to carry the message to the addict who still suffers. In the practice of regional service, challenges arise that require an organized, participatory, and spiritually aligned response. This project is born as a tool to listen to our conscience, identify real priorities, and guide regional efforts responsibly. It is not about modifying the structure, but about strengthening it through informed collective awareness. 2. SPIRITUAL AND CONCEPTUAL FRAMEWORK

This project is based on:

- Unity as the foundation of all service.
- Group consciousness as the final authority.
- Participation as an expression of responsibility.
- Principles before personalities.
- Service as an expression of gratitude and recovery.

The process should be developed with open-mindedness, respect, and goodwill.

3. PROJECT PURPOSE

To generate a participatory regional process that allows:

- Detecting real needs.
- Identifying priority problems.
- Recognizing structural challenges.
- Strengthening regional unity.
- Developing a strategic and operational plan for 2026-2028.

4. SCOPE

- Applicable to the entire Argentine Region.
- Voluntary and anonymous participation.
- Involves interested Areas, Groups, and members.
- Development period: March 2026 - March 2028.

5. GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- Unity before opinion.
- Transparency in criteria and results.
- Broad participation.
- Respect for the autonomy of Areas.
- Permanent focus on the primary purpose.

6. IMPLEMENTATION MANUAL

6.1 Approval - March 2026

- Formal presentation of the project at the Regional Assembly.
- Responsible debate.
- Institutional approval.
- Formation of a temporary Coordinating Team.

6.2 Survey Design - April to June 2026

New emerging groups are added to our website's meeting list as Loner Groups that are not affiliated with any Area Service. Some Areas organize informal outreach efforts to support other groups who might be new, rural, or in existence for a long time but needing support.

The Arkansas Region utilized a regional survey during this conference cycle to gather input on priorities and service effectiveness. Response rates were limited; however, the feedback initiated a larger strategic planning discussion at the RSC meetings. Planning at the RSC level continues to be discussion-based and responsive to emerging needs rather than driven by a formal long-term strategic plan.

This allows Areas to provide clarification or perspective that may inform amendments or motions that cannot return to groups for further discussion within the timeline.

We review the main points outlined in the delegate PowerPoint and facilitate workshops around the discussion topics to encourage broader understanding and input.**

CAT items are discussed at the RSC meeting, and input is gathered from Areas through their RCMs. Final decisions are made in alignment with the delegate's responsibility and discretion at the World Service Conference.**

Innovations and Challenges

What subject generated the most interest and discussion in your region this cycle?

The subject that generated the most sustained discussion during this conference cycle was service structure alignment and how the Region makes decisions. This included how the Regional Service Committee applies Consensus-Based Decision Making (CBDM), and how written guidelines either support or hinder that practice. A full review of regional guidelines was initiated to streamline language, remove conflicting references to Robert's Rules, and shift from restrictive procedures toward clearer guidance. Many detailed procedures are being moved into working procedure guides to better reflect how the body functions in practice.

Additional areas of significant discussion included predatory behavior in meetings, maintaining clarity of the NA message amid the growth of recovery-related professions such as peer support, and ongoing service participation challenges. Conversations also addressed public relations structure, particularly concerns about H&I-style efforts being initiated without committee oversight, and how to ensure consistency and accountability.

Technology and communication practices also generated discussion, including challenges integrating YAP for text-based meeting search due to outdated documentation, and the transition to a virtual mailbox system to improve efficiency and oversight.

Please describe the most significant challenge your region has faced since WSC 2023.

The most significant challenge during this cycle has been how to effectively serve a geographically large and partially rural state with uneven Area coverage.

The Region created a visual service coverage map to better understand which counties were supported by an Area and which remained uncovered. This clarified gaps in fellowship development, public relations, and H&I support across rural portions of the state. The challenge has been determining how best to support emerging meetings and new groups forming in areas with little or no established NA presence, while maintaining connection to the broader service structure.

Service participation has also presented challenges. Sustaining engagement beyond a small number of trusted servants continues to require attention. During this cycle, the Region experienced a mid-cycle delegate team transition, which highlighted the need for clearer onboarding processes and mentorship continuity.

Administrative challenges were addressed through a completed treasurer audit and procedural revision, as well as restructuring efforts to clarify roles, simplify communication functions, and align practice with CBDM.

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

During this conference cycle, the Arkansas Region implemented several structural and outreach improvements.

A standardized process was established to respond to all inmate correspondence, ensuring consistent and timely communication with incarcerated individuals seeking information about NA. The Region secured liability insurance to better protect groups and service activities.

The "Basic Text for Jails" project has gained momentum, with ongoing efforts to place a Basic Text in every jail in Arkansas. Emerging groups continue to be supported through locally assembled starter kits and are listed on the regional website as Loner Groups when not yet affiliated with an Area.

The Region completed a major guidelines overhaul to simplify language, reduce procedural rigidity, and better align written guidance with how the RSC functions and makes decisions. Financial practices were strengthened through a completed audit and updated procedures.

The Arkansas Regional Convention held during this cycle was successful and had measurable community impact. Treatment centers attended, requests for literature increased, and the hosting Area has submitted a bid to host again, reflecting strengthened local engagement.

Their area chair is very happy to announce they have freedom to do whatever they want regardless of service structure, traditions, concepts, the outdated guide to local service, and group booklet.**

A lot of education has been helpful to our members in our region.

Our convention committee is rogue. They do not care to follow their own guidelines or roberts rules of order. They have a bully who has threatened people, misuses NA funds, degrades and demeans people, and the committee is afraid of him or agrees with him. Some of the administrative body took their positions for selfish service instead of selfless service, they lied from the gate when receiving the bid, and some of our members in various areas refuse to attend this year. The delegate team and RSC chair went to a few meetings with negative results. The committee was angry and defensive. They do not agree that they are a subcommittee of the RSC and the bully has even stated they will keep their overflow funds after the convention is over. That won't happen, but the immaturity, the lack of selfless service, and firing their subcommittee chairs a few times has hurt them. Currently they are track to lose money. Unfortunately, our RSCs revenue stream depends on the convention profits to sustain the activities of the RSC. It's a mess. I'm grateful to roll off this May before the convention and stay away from the mess. There is no spiritual principles or concepts of service they want to hear, discuss, or acknowledge.

It has been an amazing time to be with all of the members for all these years. I am so very grateful to have learned so much about service structure and to help so many people in our area and attend our zone presentations to the USA and the world. What an amazing journey. Distance and the inability to develop NA where we are not yet present is a current challenge (our region encompasses 10 provinces and over 1,000,000 km²). In many cities, there is only one group, and it is far from cities with servers that can support growth. When the Region was formed, there were no groups in two provinces, and today, groups have been established and meetings held in one of them. In the province that still lacks groups, the capital (and most populated) is over 450 km (a 6-hour drive) from the nearest cities with groups and members who can provide support. Coordinating and planning in-person activities is a challenge, and we are planning virtual activities to raise awareness of Narcotics Anonymous through online platforms (providing information about virtual/hybrid groups).

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

We are a new Region formed as a result of the growth of the Argentina Region. The servers currently serving in this new region gained experience serving for several years in the Argentina Region. The main reason for forming this new region has been, and continues to be, to allow NA to grow geographically while carefully managing funds and using them wisely, as well as the time and effort of the servers. Beyond the debates and personalities that sometimes create differences (which we are not immune to), this objective continues to guide our operations month after month. This new Region allows servers to travel shorter distances and spend less time, resulting in a more efficient use of resources. We are also developing NA taking into account the idiosyncrasies and customs of the inhabitants of the different provinces, which allows for consistency in service efforts.

 * **The Unhoused Community - the admin offices, the apartments, shelters, and clinics.**

*** Rual Communities - Our Regional and Area PR/PI/H&I committees make monthly trips around the region to attend and support groups in the outline portion of the state. See below for a broader scope of some of the PR projects**

Our PR and H&I Regional committees meet regularly with the Area's PR/H&I chairs using the Strategic Plan to best map out how to reach addicts on the streets, in shelters, in isolation, and in correctional facilities. They reach out to community members on a regular basis.

If you have had any particular successes with utilizing technology in new ways within your region and/or areas, please share them. **We have had great success utilizing technology in our region. During the pandemic we held several virtual meetings and were able to bring speaker meetings into several correctional facilities simultaneously. Each facility only saw the speaker and the chairperson. They did not see each other. This was very beneficial when speaking with the administration about virtual meetings.**

We have a tech program called Tech Soup. Under this program we have 9 individual Zoom accounts and numerous regional emails. Each Area has their own Zoom account along with each regional subcommittees and events such as conventions, retreats, and campouts. This allows each entity to oversee their individual Zoom accounts without overlapping with other committee's virtual meetings.

Our region along with most of our areas and groups use Venmo and Zelle to transfer funds and accept donations.

We have several all virtual homegroups that meet weekly and daily. We have a homegroup that meets twice a day with multiple trusted servants allowing all members to be in the middle of the boat and tethered to the fellowship. These positions are key tag persons (7), greeters (14), chairs (14), cochairs (14), literature person, treasurer, secretary, attendance verification person, email person, speaker seeker, virtual field trip chair, activities chairs (2), tech support (3). The lit chair mails out Basic Texts to newcomer and key tags/medallions to recognize clean time. Each one of these positions have various suggested clean time which allows for all addicts to have a spot!

Our region, areas, and groups utilize Facebook, Instagram, and WhatsApp for communication and announcements.

Please describe the different types of public relations efforts (PR/PI) carried out in your region.

Following the WCNA "The Power of Love" and in collaboration with other regions, the Colorado Region Public Relations Committee expanded their efforts of taking virtual NA meetings into prisons around the World. The first of these meetings, The Freedom of Choice, was developed out of the Ohio Region and then Colorado's PR Committee created Miraculous Mondays. Both meetings occur twice a month on opposite weeks. Miraculous Monday included 120 incarcerated members from 12 correctional facilities with 46 yards in Arizona able to watch via CCTV. Members from Turkey, Portugal,

Angola, India, and Canada along with 7 Regions from the United States. This meeting is comprised of inmates, prison administrators, World NA PR members, and members of Narcotics Anonymous. These services are in collaboration with other regions such as Ohio and Arizona.

The PR Committee provides a "Professionals Day" during the annual convention, CRCNA, which includes administrators from the unhoused coalition, correctional facilities, the mayor of Denver, the Attorney General, and the Governor. This presentation is hybrid and invites everyone to join.

One of the most significant challenges our region has experienced as a whole is low attendance at local events and during area meetings. Our region remains strong and is able to fill positions. We are also financially stable, however not as we were prior to the pandemic.

Another challenge we have faced locally - meetings, groups, and even area - are members introducing themselves as 'and a' or using other fellowships' language. It seems more prevalent than in past years and we believe it have to do with coming out of the pandemic where meeting structure (for lack of a better word) might have been lacking. Some members seem to have several home groups and attend other fellowships. We are gradually guiding our newer members of the importance of carrying the message of Narcotics Anonymous and having a homegroup where members get to know us. Also, the importance of having a solid, fun, and encouraging support system.

1. Each participant shall have the right to one vote. No member may speak more than once on a motion unless the other members who wish to speak have already had the opportunity to do so.

2. CONFERENCE FACILITATOR:
The Facilitator has the task of helping the Conference to reach a consensus. To achieve this, we must know that: He ensures everyone understands the process and the topic to be discussed. He will encourage everyone's participation, even the quietest. He will listen to identify common ideas and may suggest them. He will repeat and categorize ideas to ensure understanding. He will suggest ways to combine ideas for consensus. He will manage time and focus the conversation towards decisions. He will keep the agenda in order. If someone is out of order, we must address the issue. The facilitator will ensure that everyone understands the decisions and actions. The facilitator may change the agenda according to

what needs to be prioritized. Members will have a maximum speaking time of two minutes each time the facilitator gives them the floor. The facilitator may extend this limit when they believe such a measure is justified. Any member may appeal a decision of the facilitator. If so, the discussion is interrupted: The appealing member has 2 minutes to present their argument. The facilitator has 2 minutes to present their argument. A simple majority vote (half + 1) is taken, and the conference continues.

5. For the Conference, a quorum (the number of voting members who must be present to discuss a matter) will be taken before each matter to be discussed.

6. Every motion must be seconded. Once seconded, a motion belongs to the Conference. If no one seconds a motion, it is not even discussed; the motion is withdrawn, and the meeting moves on to the next motion.

7. To pass a motion, a two-thirds majority of those present is required.

8. When there is consensus on a topic in an opinion poll, the Conference may decide whether to adopt it as a decision. Debate takes place only if necessary. The opinion poll could be conducted several times on the same issue.

9. Once a motion belongs to the Conference, debate proceeds only if necessary. If a member proposes blocking it, the Facilitator will give them two minutes to argue why the motion should be blocked. The Facilitator may ask the member to focus on why the motion should be blocked, and if they believe the conference needs further information, they may ask trusted staff to provide it so that the conference clearly understands the issue. A vote is then taken to block the motion by a simple majority (half + 1).

10. Once a motion belongs to the Conference, amendments to the main motion may be presented. Amendments must be accepted by the service body that presented the motion. Members may speak about a motion or amendment only if the facilitator gives them the floor. When a motion is presented, the facilitator may give the floor to any participant who proposes a modification, an amendment, or makes a suggestion to the Conference. Once the debate on a motion has concluded, the Conference decides the matter by vote. If the motion receives two-thirds support in the Conference, the following rules apply: • Once all responses have been tallied, the facilitator declares that the motion is approved by consensus. Participants may choose to be present but not participate in the vote. This means they will not be counted in the total votes for that motion. In other words, they leave the quorum. This differs from abstaining. An abstention counts as a vote in support of the majority.

13. Every motion passed will take effect at the close of the Conference, unless otherwise specified in the motion.

14. If at any time during the conference a participant has a personal emergency or a problem requiring the facilitator's attention, the participant may be attended to, and the facilitator will determine how to address the problem. **USEFUL CONCEPTS:** Poll: A poll is a tool for gauging the Conference's position on a particular issue. It is an informal survey. Often, motions or amendments are polled more than once during the debate.

Voting:

Voting takes place when the conference makes a decision on a topic.

Opinion polls can give an idea of the Conference's position on a specific topic and can be used in various ways, in addition to those described above.

Debate for the process of approving the previous minutes and approving or revising the work plans.

Approval of the minutes:

The Facilitator places the topic to be discussed on the conference floor. Regarding the approval of the previous minutes, the question is asked if anyone disagrees with their approval. If so, the request for a change is heard. If the facilitator believes the discussion needs further information, a discussion period is opened to reach an agreement. Once this period is over, consensus is sought through voting. The minutes are approved by 2/3.

Approval of plans, review of progress and accountability of a work plan:

1. The Facilitator places the plan to be discussed on the conference floor.

1. Regarding the review of plans:

- a. The coordinator of each RSC Subcommittee and Delegates will present to the conference to expand on their work plan or progress report, not to read the report.
- b. A space will be opened for participants to ask specific questions (not comments) seeking to clarify the information contained in their work plans.
- c. Once the doubts have been clarified, a space will be opened for generating agreements, direction in the work plans, and budget changes. Any member may call me to account; the consensus-based decision-making process encourages us to reach an agreement on the purpose through respectful discussion.
- d. Approval of a plan requires 2/3.

The debate for the motion decision process

1. The motion is presented
2. Facilitator asks: Who seconds the motion?
3. The person who presented the motion is given time to expand on the information for the Conference
4. If someone believes the motion should be blocked, the facilitator may give them 2 minutes to argue for the block. The server who proposed the motion may, if they wish, use 2 minutes to argue why it is important to approve the motion. The debate is stopped and the block is voted on.
5. If the conference decides to continue, the facilitator asks the conference if there are any amendments? Amendments must be accepted by the server who proposed the motion. The Facilitator may, during this process, encourage discussion so that the Conference can reach an agreement, refining the motion without losing its core message.
6. Once the main motion (amended or not) has been finalized and clarified, an opinion poll is conducted to ascertain the Conference's position. If the poll reaches a consensus, the Conference may consider the poll as a final decision without further debate.

7. If the poll does not reach a consensus, further discussion and information are required. Two servers opposing the motion and two supporting it are heard. Virtual sessions should be considered on equal footing with in-person sessions.
 8. After hearing the presented positions, the Conference will determine if there is consensus and if the discussion has changed support for the motion. The Facilitator may consider whether to conduct a second opinion poll or proceed to a vote.
 9. If consensus is reached, the Facilitator will announce it. If there is no consensus, the debate will continue until a decision is reached.
- The debate for the candidate selection process at a conference or extraordinary virtual meeting.
1. Quorum is raised. Participants must have their cameras on.
 2. The candidacy is read. That is; The complete statement of their candidacy is read, including their vision of service.
 3. The candidate is allowed to introduce themselves (2 minutes)
 4. Two participants with voice and vote who are in favor of the candidacy and two participants with voice and vote who disagree with the candidacy are given the floor (2 MINUTES per person so they can argue their position). Comments for or against a candidate should not be strictly about service.
 5. If questions were asked of the candidate, they are allowed to answer
 6. The election proceeds. ALL SERVERS WITH VIRTUAL VOTING MUST HAVE THEIR CAMERAS OPEN EACH TIME AN ELECTION OR COUNT IS HELD. FOR THE SAKE OF ORDER
 7. A question is asked of those who disagree with the candidacy. (In this case, those who disagree raise their virtual hand) the count is carried out
 8. If 2/3 are in favor, the candidate is elected. IF 2/3 IS NOT REACHED, AS A LAST RESORT, THE SERVER IS ELECTED BY SIMPLE MAJORITY (HALF + 1). Remember that in NA we are not against anyone, we simply agree or disagree. It is much more spiritual. Useful resources that we cannot forget. During the discussion of a motion or amendment, polls can be taken to gauge the opinion of the conference and see if the debate is progressing. Before voting on an item, participants will be asked if they are prepared to make a decision. Those who need more information about the decision or have doubts about the process will have this opportunity to ask those urgent questions. The facilitators may decide at any time to end the debate and proceed to the final vote on the issue under consideration. If any of the amendments are approved, the main motion will be changed accordingly, and once the amendments have been decided, the conference will use the same debate process to discuss and make a decision regarding the main motion. It will always remain possible to request that a motion that does not reach consensus be referred to the next conference for study, refinement, or to use an amendment to improve a motion.

Among the concrete actions we undertake are: Supporting groups or GSFs at different stages of development through specific tools and resources; organizing and supporting regional conferences; developing thematic workshops that attract members to service and contribute to the growth of the region; coordinating global celebrations such as World Unity Day, World Service Day, and World Sponsorship Day, with hybrid support alongside the Technology Committee; and developing integration and collaboration strategies with other regional service committees. In the Costa Rica Region, Specifically, strategies such as the following are implemented: Forming a work team committed to the mission and vision of the DC Committee; Delegating functions and organizing delivery times for workshops and activities; Managing resources to attract more volunteers; Maintaining effective communication with GSFs and other committees; Prioritizing the allocation of human resources according to geographical and group needs; Generating virtual workshops as a tool for regional growth; Thanks to these actions, the continuous development of fellowship and the strengthening of ties between members and groups in our region are ensured.

Annually, through our GPI, we hold a planning week where all members of the region are invited to contribute ideas to be incorporated into the annual work plans. Measurable objectives are set based on needs. 1. Environmental scanning and Data Analysis

A planning workgroup collected data from groups through tailored surveys made of 12 questions, and in an era of too much electronic communication we have adopted direct communication as a principle in our efforts. Directly reaching out to RCMs and GSR to create momentum and achieve the needed collective support for this survey.

Data was first analyzed manually, then harnessing the power of technology we have used AI to analyze data and identify key challenges, such as:

- Lack of sponsors (35.5%).
- Low meeting attendance (32.7%).
- Weak participation in service committees (25.3%).

2. Defining the Strategic Direction

Inspired by the World Board IDT methodology, the Egypt region has tailored 4 main topics to work as a general guidance on the dialogs we're aiming to spark in our local fellowship. This topics will then be used by regional subcommittees to guide their creativity in tackling these issues

Based on the findings, four main campaigns were selected:

"The Ties That Binds Us": Enhancing meeting participation quality by focusing on shared principles.

"The Distances Between Us": Addressing geographical challenges through direct communication, digital solutions and field initiatives.

"Mentorship in Our Service": Developing new leaders through dedicated mentorship programs.

"Sponsorship is the Cornerstone": Promoting sponsorship culture as a tool for recovery and service.

3. Annual Planning Meeting

Panel Meetings Model:

All subcommittee chairs (Public Relations, Support, Activities, Hospitals, Translation) gathered on one stage to discuss their plans collectively. This has proved to convey an image of unity and collaboration between different service entities.

One of the challenges we faced recently was taking on the responsibility of chairing the Planning Committee. Honestly, many of the people we were working with were saying, "There's nothing new-what's really going to happen?" But in truth, as we met with the committee, we witnessed a spirit of service that we hadn't felt before. The group was very cooperative, committed to attending, and full of ideas.

We met more than 36 times, and everyone had a role and was responsible for something. We all shared one goal: to make this day successful and to come out with real results that would serve the groups. One of the challenges we faced was communication with the groups-how to learn about their needs and challenges. We found that direct communication was the solution.

We were able to connect with members of the Regional Service Committee, who in turn helped facilitate communication with the forums. We divided ourselves among the forums, explained what we were looking for, started attending group business meetings, and worked with them to complete the survey. Through this, we reached real challenges coming from the groups-challenges that the committees can actually work on.

We also met with the committees, who were very cooperative as well. We presented the challenges to them, and each committee began looking at how to address these issues and started putting plans in place. From this working group came the idea of the service councils (the Planning Council, the Information Center, and the Human Resources Council). The Planning Council has already begun its work after its guidelines were approved.

This initiative has transformed itself into a powerful tool for public information and support for members, allowing the message of recovery to be available 24 hours a day in diverse formats. 90.2 mil views and 6,3 mil hours of publication. Our audience covers listeners in 5 countries.**

Audio Platforms (Spotify/Deezer) we reach addicts in 21 countries.

Furthermore, we have an accessibility initiative with the Santo Amaro group in conjunction with the FD committee of FZB/ABNA where we hold virtual and hybrid meetings with emphasis on people with additional auditory needs (deaf addicts) - Current phase - Virtual and hybrid meetings so that deaf addicts in Brazil, still in small numbers, can share together the NA way. People from other countries of Latin America, United States, Canada, Europe and Asia also participate when we offer the service of language interpreters.

O Grupo Santo Amaro successfully held hybrid and virtual meetings - now with a new face-to-face space being inaugurated in March, which has accessibility, and the focus will be hybrid meetings - either local or public, close to the metro and close to the specialized professional contracted to interpret books. The group also holds hybrid service meetings, held also with interpreters of Libras for those who need interaction, "isolated" addicts also participate as women with children and addicts with mobility reduced by diverse causes such as AVC and accidents. It is a recurrent, growing and moving service for the approval and development of the recovery program of NA and the culture of the deaf community.

Região Grande São Paulo adopts a multifaceted strategy of Public Relations, which combines traditional methods of dissemination with an active presence in events of great cultural and scientific relevance. Our actions are divided into four main pillars:

1. Presence at Mass Cultural Events:

Unlike conventional approaches, we leverage local culture to increase NA's visibility., using this platform of visibility to carry the message of NA.

2. fairs and events:

Aligned with the principle that "any addict can stop using", we establish cooperation and set up informative stands in human rights and inclusion events, such as the Diversity Fair and Black Consciousness Day commemorations.

3. Collaboration with the Scientific and Academic Community:

We seek to strengthen our institutional credibility through participation in forums, such as the Latin American Symposium on Drug Policies. In these spaces, we maintain our stand to inform authorities, doctors and legislators about the effectiveness of the Narcóticos Anônimos program as a free and complementary community resource.

4. Grassroots and Community Efforts:

We maintain consistency in fundamental public information activities. (PI), including the fixing of posters in units of health and public transport, pamphlets in strategic locations and the realization of Panels and the Community to present NA.

Public relations efforts in our region include a wide range of activities aimed at increasing awareness of NA as a recovery resource.

Presentations are conducted at universities, multidisciplinary psychological support centers, and to psychiatrists and other addiction professionals. We also provide presentations to local government authorities, as many of our meetings are hosted in municipal facilities, maintaining cooperative relationships at the local level. Our region participates in radio interviews and produces radio and television public service announcements. We also take part in roundtable discussions at conferences alongside other fellowships such as Al-Anon.

We are planning to approach the Ministry of Justice with the goal of increasing recognition of NA as a program in Greece. Currently, we already maintain cooperation with several correctional facilities across the country.

At the professional level, our region participates once per year in a national addiction-focused event (PPA), where various recovery and treatment organizations exhibit. NA maintains its own informational booth at this event.

Several subjects generated significant interest and discussion in our region during the past conference cycle.

One of the primary topics was communication and the flow of information between the regional service committee, area representatives, and groups. There has been ongoing discussion about improving communication, ensuring that groups are well informed about regional and world service matters, and encouraging greater participation and feedback from groups. Another subject that generated considerable discussion was the translation of NA literature. Our translation committee has completed substantial work, but the approval process for translated materials requires time, and this has been an important topic within the region. The role, responsibility, and accountability of trusted servants was also widely discussed, particularly the importance of consistent service and reliability in trusted servant positions.

Please describe the most significant challenge your region has faced since WSC 2023.

The most significant challenge our region has faced has been a shortage of trusted servants at the regional level. While many members are actively serving within areas, it has been difficult to sustain some regional committees due to limited available members. In some cases, committees have become inactive as a result. This challenge has reinforced the importance of developing new trusted servants and encouraging participation in regional service.

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

Although the region has faced challenges at the regional level, area-level service remains active and productive. Development of Fellowship, Public Relations, and Hospitals and Institutions committees at the area level continue to carry out consistent service and outreach activities. These efforts include cooperation with professionals and institutions, public information activities, and ongoing work to support the growth of NA and carry the message.

To achieve regional unity, there are still many groups that are very apathetic, especially their leaders, which affects us in terms of staffing to fill the positions in the service subcommittees.

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

We are a Growing Region. After the 2023 WSC, we managed to update all our legal information. We now have legal status as the Narcotics Anonymous Association of Guatemala. We are up to date with the Tax Administration Superintendency, which facilitated the import of merchandise purchased from WSO. Bank accounts with dual signatures were opened to better control money management. A small space was rented for RSO to operate and store the Region's merchandise and furniture. A special worker

was hired to support us with accounting. Computer and multimedia equipment was acquired to hold virtual and hybrid meetings (1 laptop, 1 projector, 1 hands-free microphone, and 1 small webcam). Growth: Although our region has decreased in membership, after the 2023 WSC, two new groups have been opened. We are a fairly small region, with many financial limitations, but we are making the necessary efforts to function properly and continue supporting the groups in fulfilling their primary purpose. We have 15 in-person groups and 3 virtual groups, of which 11 in-person and 1 virtual groups participate in the RSC. In the RSC, we have vacancies in the sub-coordinations of Public Relations, Magazine, Fellowship Development, and Ad Hoc Committee. In the EC, we have vacancies in the positions of Secretary, Sub-coordinator, and Alternate Regional Delegate. In July 2026, we will hold our next ASR, where we will elect our trusted servants, entrusting this assembly to our PS and asking that the service positions be filled. We are in discussions with the LAZF to support the integration of the Honduras and El Salvador Regions so that they can be integrated and restructured. We will have a space during our 11th Regional Convention to hold a learning day and begin discussions on integrating all the Central American Regions. On behalf of my Region, I want to thank NAWS, WSO, WB, LAZF, and all the NA Fellows from around the world who are here, who have supported and visited us. Even though we are a small region with many limitations, we are part of this great fellowship that is changing lives and making miracles continue to happen. Thank you, thank you very much.

Yes, The FD Committee is a relatively new position. It's main responsibilities are to reach out to professionals in the community and ensure they're aware of our existence, and coordinate/oversee our annual Learning Days event. These two roles were previously assigned to the RD Team, but they were reassigned in 20242-2025 when FD was approved by the fellowship. Additionally at least two of the ASC's hold their own Learning Days events for on-island members, and one has engaged in their own PR presentations to the local professional community.

Describe what kind of planning your region and/or its areas utilize.

Currently, I am unaware of any ASC's using an official Strategic Planning process. Planning efforts are localized and specific to needs as required. Several of the ASC's have communicated to each other and shared challenges/solutions directly with one another, in addition to challenges/solutions being addressed at RSC meetings. RSC meetings are planned/coordinated by the Chair/Admin, utilizing a standard agenda from the P&G. Regional Convention and Area Gatherings utilize standard planning process as outlined in the specific P&G for those events, or input from previous participants/admin. On the whole, Strategic Planning is a newer concept that hasn't been implemented into the service structure yet. As a member of the APF Zonal, we are aware of its benefit to the APF, as well as to the WSC. Strategic Planning will be discussed at our next RSC meeting and in our Delegate Collab meetings to bring awareness to our members.

If you have had any particular successes with utilizing technology in new ways within your region and/or areas, please share them. Our quarterly HRSC BOD/Admin meetings were historically F2F the Friday night immediately preceding the RSC meeting on Saturday/Sunday. This has been changed to an all virtual meeting, and the P&G has been changed to reflect this. Our ASC's have had significant change in the adoption of virtual meetings, and last year a new, all virtual ASC and meetings.

As the RD Team, we wanted to increase participation in our efforts to inform our local members of the work we do on their behalf. Last year we started a monthly Delegate Collab meeting, to give interested members a virtual platform to meet with the delegate team, ask questions, provide updates, workshops, CAR presentations, etc.

Please describe the different types of public relations efforts (PR/PI) carried out in your region.

Each Area (island) has their own local government, and various local offices for state government. As most of these organizations are geographically isolated from one another, they have their own local administrators, and community organizations, i.e. Salvation Army, treatment facilities, etc. Each island supports the various local events catering to mental health/substance abuse/community awareness for both providers and clients/patients. At least one of the islands holds their own PR Event for professionals, and the RSC FD Coordinator facilitates an annual PR event on one island. In the recent past this has been planned around the island hosting the annual Regional Convention of NA. The past few years however have not seen this happen. Several islands have a booth or table at the annual State Fair, which actually travels to all of the islands during the summer months, and this allows the local PR/PI committee to participate in this outreach effort. Most of the ASC's have local members distribute meeting schedules to hospitals, judiciary/parole, mental health and treatment facilities, to ensure our presence is known to those searching for us. Several islands have created PSA's for the local radio stations to broadcast, and our RSC created bus placards to display on the local public transportation. As we are a unique community in that we are an island state, as well as one of the few remaining that still have one state-wide area code, we created a phone

line for the state to allow PR a single point of contact state-wide for professionals to reach them. The initial idea was to have this number as a one-stop point for addicts seeking recovery state-wide to reach a recovering addict, but the outcome changed. This effort was recently readdressed and a workgroup has initiated the process once again to make one, state-wide number available to addicts, visitors, or others seeking a meeting.

- **Division and Creation of a New Region:** The most intense debate around the exit of 6 areas for the formation of a new region. This involved complex discussions about the proportional division of the cash and the service charges that are occupied by servers that will be in the new geographical area. materials Later, the interest migrated to the management of large projects, such as the National Service Conference (CNS) 2027 where it was approved the purchase of a subscription for each regional server and the migration of bank accounts for institutions with better rates (Sicoob). Acronyms in written texts, aimed at facilitating comprehension for new members, as well as forms for completing reports – both for groups and subcommittees.

Please describe the most significant challenge your region has faced since WSC 2023.

The most critical and persistent challenge is the crisis of service renovation (open tasks) called for the complexity of geographical restructuring:

- **Lack of Servers:** The most significant challenge is the permanence of diverse open tasks in our regional structure. Vital functions such as Vice Coordenação, Secretaria, Tesouraria e Conselho Fiscal do not attract volunteers with a necessary frequency. As a result, our servers need to accumulate responsibilities so that the message of NA continues to be lifted, thereby reducing the burden that hinders the expansion of our services. regional coordinators have made available and fomenting meetings with the coordinators of the subcommittees in the areas, there is a difficulty in participating in the representatives of the areas or that it is difficult to develop and to improve the efforts of how to carry a message.

For a long time, such an atmosphere prevailed in NA Iran.

In such circumstances, during the region, most of our time was wasted on discussions and finding solutions, and during this period we were behind the topics of the conference.

In the chaotic situation created by the old region, the groups gradually became aware of the facts and the Region 1 was regularly faced with many requests from areas that wanted to join Region 1.

The region worked on the conditions of the merger regularly.

This situation caused Region 1 to suddenly become 28 areas from a 12 areas and we were very busy with such issues.

Most importantly was the illegal action of the old region to print NA publications, which all members spent a lot of time and energy to prevent the continuation of this ugly work.

The STC also played a significant role in opening new groups, organizing open meetings, and providing promotional materials. Awareness was raised through emails, printed flyers, videos, and brochures. As a result of these efforts, new groups were established in several areas across Italy. Since the founding of STC FD nearly eight years ago, the number of groups in our region has more than doubled.

The Narcotics Anonymous Kenya Region RSC uses Consensus-Based Decision Making (CBDM) as its primary method for reaching decisions, and several Areas within the region have also adopted the same approach. At the regional level, CBDM has strengthened unity and participation. Rather than relying on simple majority voting, discussions are structured to ensure every trusted servant has an opportunity to be heard. Motions are presented clearly, background information is shared in advance where possible, and members engage in open dialogue guided by the principles of recovery and service. The focus is not on winning an argument but on arriving at a decision the body can support collectively. When concerns arise, they are addressed respectfully and directly. Members are encouraged to express reservations, and the body works to amend proposals where necessary. This process often leads to stronger, more thoughtful outcomes because decisions reflect broad**

input rather than narrow margins. CBDM has also helped build trust among Areas by reinforcing transparency and accountability in regional deliberations.

Within some Areas, CBDM is practiced in Area Service Committee meetings, particularly when handling sensitive matters such as event planning, financial decisions, or service structure adjustments. While levels of familiarity may vary, ongoing orientation and informal mentoring continue to improve understanding of the model. Over time, members have reported increased collaboration, reduced conflict, and clearer ownership of collective decisions.

Overall, CBDM in the NA Kenya Region functions as both a practical decision-making tool and a reflection of spiritual principles such as unity, responsibility, and mutual respect. It supports the region's commitment to service grounded in inclusion and shared conscience.

Service Delivery & Best Practices

Are fellowship development (FD) or outreach efforts provided within your region?

Yes, Yes. Fellowship Development (FD) and outreach efforts are active within the Narcotics Anonymous Kenya Region, with a strong focus on Learning Day events as a primary platform for growth and capacity building.

Fellowship Development Through Learning Days

The region organizes structured Learning Day events at both Regional and Area levels. These gatherings are designed to strengthen service understanding, improve group stability, and support emerging Areas. Sessions typically cover:

The NA service structure and roles of trusted servants

Consensus-Based Decision Making (CBDM)

Financial accountability and reporting

Event planning and convention preparation

Public Relations (PR) and outreach fundamentals

Sponsorship and group sustainability

Learning Days are interactive. Members engage in workshops, small-group discussions, and experience-sharing panels. The emphasis is practical-participants leave with tools they can apply directly in their home groups and Area Service Committees.

Outreach and Area Support

FD efforts also include outreach visits to developing or struggling Areas. Regional trusted servants and experienced members attend local service meetings upon request to offer guidance, share best practices, and mentor newer members in service roles. This support is collaborative rather than directive, respecting group autonomy while promoting unity.

Outreach extends to supporting new meetings in underserved locations and strengthening communication between Areas. When necessary, virtual platforms are used to reach members in distant regions to ensure inclusion.

FD/Outreach Structure

The region coordinates these efforts through an FD-focused function within the regional service structure. While not always a standalone committee, Fellowship Development is integrated into the Regional Service Committee's priorities, with designated trusted servants helping plan Learning Days and outreach visits.

Overall, FD and outreach within NA Kenya are grounded in the principle that strong groups build a strong region. Learning Day events have become a consistent and effective method for equipping members, nurturing leadership, and ensuring sustainable growth across the fellowship.

Describe what kind of planning your region and/or its areas utilize.

The Narcotics Anonymous Kenya Region utilizes structured, principle-based planning at both Regional and Area levels to guide service delivery. Planning is intentional, collaborative, and aligned with the fellowship's primary purpose.

1. Annual Regional Planning

At the beginning of each service year, the Regional Service Committee (RSC) develops a simple but focused annual plan. This includes:

Key priorities such as Fellowship Development (FD), Public Relations (PR), and event coordination

Budget projections aligned with planned activities

Timelines for major events such as conventions, Learning Days, and Speaker Jams

Defined responsibilities for subcommittees and trusted servants

This plan acts as a roadmap rather than a rigid document. It is reviewed regularly and adjusted based on emerging needs.

2. Event-Based Planning

For major regional activities such as conventions and fundraisers, ad hoc planning committees are formed. These committees work with clear task allocations, timelines, and reporting structures. Planning typically includes:

Budget estimation and financial tracking

Venue identification and logistics coordination

Registration systems and merchandise planning

Program drafting with defined roles and timeframes

Regular progress updates are presented at RSC meetings to ensure accountability and transparency.

3. Area-Level Planning

Areas conduct their own service planning through Area Service Committees (ASCs).

Planning focuses on:

Supporting group stability

Outreach to new or struggling meetings

Local Learning Days

Public Relations efforts within their communities

Some Areas are gradually adopting more structured planning models, including quarterly reviews and goal-setting discussions.

4. Consensus and Reporting

Planning decisions are guided by Consensus-Based Decision Making (CBDM), encouraging broad participation and collective ownership. Financial planning is accompanied by clear reporting, including income, expenses, and projected needs.

Open communication

Regular reporting and review

Mentorship of newer trusted servants

Overall, NA Kenya's planning model balances structure with flexibility. It ensures that service delivery remains focused, transparent, and responsive to the needs of the fellowship while upholding unity and accountability.

1. Virtual Meetings and Hybrid Access

One of the region's most significant successes has been the expansion of virtual NA meetings. These meetings increased accessibility for members in remote counties and for those unable to attend physical meetings. Virtual platforms have also supported continuity during times when physical gatherings were limited.

Some Areas have adopted hybrid formats, allowing members to participate both physically and online. This has improved inclusion and strengthened connection between geographically distant members.

2. Monthly Regional Virtual Service Meetings

The region utilizes online platforms for Regional Service Committee (RSC) and Fellowship Development (FD) meetings. This has:

Reduced travel costs

Increased participation from distant Areas

Allowed consistent monthly engagement

Strengthened coordination across counties

Virtual service spaces have proven especially helpful in mentoring new trusted servants and maintaining structured communication.

3. Online Registration and Event Coordination

For regional events such as conventions and Speaker Jam fundraisers, the region has introduced digital registration forms and online communication channels. This has improved efficiency in tracking participants, managing data, and coordinating logistics. The Narcotics Anonymous Kenya Region carries out Public Relations (PR) and Public Information (PI) efforts aimed at increasing awareness of NA's message while preserving anonymity and adhering to the Twelve Traditions. These efforts are coordinated at both Regional and Area levels, depending on capacity and local needs.

1. Institutional Outreach

The region engages institutions that interact directly with people affected by addiction. These include:

Hospitals and treatment centers

Rehabilitation facilities

Correctional institutions

Community-based organizations

PR representatives provide NA information materials, explain how NA works, and clarify referral pathways. In some cases, presentations are conducted to professional staff to ensure they understand NA's non-professional, peer-led model.

2. Learning Days and Community Awareness

Learning Day events sometimes incorporate PR-focused sessions that educate members on how to present NA responsibly in the community. These sessions strengthen members' understanding of the Traditions, especially regarding anonymity and cooperation without affiliation.

In certain Areas, community awareness activities are conducted through informational visits and dialogue with local leaders.

3. Printed and Digital Materials

The region distributes NA literature, meeting schedules, and informational leaflets. Where possible, meeting information is shared digitally through structured communication channels to ensure accessibility and accuracy.

Efforts have also included collaboration with Local Translation Committees to make literature more accessible to local language speakers.

This process strengthens awareness of the connection between regional service and world service.

In many cases, breakout discussions are used to encourage participation from group representatives and newer trusted servants. This allows members to express perspectives, ask clarifying questions, and deepen their understanding of NA's global direction.

Discussing non-motion sections of the CAR has helped the region:

Improve service literacy

Encourage informed participation at the world level

Strengthen unity by aligning local understanding with global fellowship efforts

Overall, engagement with the full CAR-not only motions-reflects NA Kenya's commitment to informed, responsible participation in the worldwide fellowship.

This process mirrors the fellowship's approach to CAR discussions and is treated with careful attention to both inclusivity and principle. The RSC, along with Area Service Committees, reviews CAT material to understand proposed projects, literature drafts, and service initiatives before providing input. Learning Day events and regional meetings are often used as platforms to present the material to group representatives, explain the context, and facilitate discussion.

Members are encouraged to share their perspectives based on experience, local needs, and understanding of NA principles. The feedback process is structured to ensure that all voices are heard, concerns are addressed, and a unified regional conscience can be conveyed. Trusted servants collect input systematically, often using discussion summaries or digital forms, to reflect the collective view of the fellowship.

Engaging in CAT conscience-gathering has helped NA Kenya:

Strengthen members' understanding of proposed worldwide initiatives

Build experience in structured discussion and consensus-based feedback

Ensure that regional perspectives are represented responsibly at the world level

Overall, this process demonstrates NA Kenya's commitment to thoughtful, informed participation in worldwide fellowship decisions while maintaining transparency, inclusion, and adherence to the Twelve Traditions.

Innovations and Challenges

What subject generated the most interest and discussion in your region this cycle?

Within the Narcotics Anonymous Kenya Region, the subject that generated the most interest and sustained discussion over the past conference cycle has been service structure and decision-making effectiveness, particularly the implementation of Consensus-Based Decision Making (CBDM).

1. Understanding and Applying CBDM

As the region continues to grow, many Areas have been navigating how to move from majority voting to a more consensus-driven model. This shift prompted meaningful dialogue about participation, accountability, and the spiritual principles behind collective conscience. Members engaged deeply in understanding how CBDM works in practice—especially when disagreements arise or when urgent decisions are required. Learning Days and regional meetings dedicated time to clarifying roles, improving facilitation skills, and strengthening group conscience processes.

2. Regional Growth and Structural Stability

Rapid expansion across counties also sparked discussions about how to maintain unity while supporting developing Areas. Questions included:

How to mentor new trusted servants effectively

How to balance autonomy with regional guidance

How to ensure financial sustainability as activities increase

These conversations reflected a shared concern about building a structure strong enough to support long-term growth.

3. Financial Sustainability

Financial development was another closely related topic. Members discussed prudent budgeting, transparent reporting, and ways to strengthen contributions without placing pressure on groups.

Overall Reflection

The most active discussions were not about controversy, but about responsibility. As NA Kenya grows, members are increasingly focused on improving how decisions are made, how service is delivered, and how unity is preserved. The tone of these discussions has been constructive, centered on strengthening the region's capacity to carry the message effectively and sustainably.

Please describe the most significant challenge your region has faced since WSC 2023.

The most significant challenge faced by the Narcotics Anonymous Kenya Region since the World Service Conference 2023 has been balancing rapid regional growth with limited financial and service capacity.

1. Growth Outpacing Structure

Since 2023, NA Kenya has experienced steady expansion in meetings across multiple counties. While this growth is encouraging, it has placed pressure on the existing service structure. New groups require mentorship, service orientation, and administrative support. In several Areas, there has been a shortage of experienced trusted servants to fully support emerging needs.

2. Financial Constraints

Financial sustainability remains a major challenge. Travel across counties is costly, and in-person service delivery, outreach visits, and event coordination require consistent funding. While members contribute faithfully, economic realities in the region sometimes limit contributions, affecting the scale and frequency of regional initiatives.

3. Service Experience and Continuity

As leadership transitions occur, maintaining continuity and institutional memory has required intentional effort. Some Areas are still developing familiarity with structured service models such as Consensus-Based Decision Making (CBDM) and formal planning processes. Continuous Fellowship Development has been necessary to stabilize service delivery.

4. Public Relations Capacity

Although PR efforts are expanding, limited human resources and logistical capacity have slowed outreach to institutions in some regions. Building strong, consistent PR structures across all Areas remains a work in progress.

5. Technology Adaptation

While virtual platforms have strengthened communication, not all members have equal access to reliable internet or digital tools. Bridging this digital gap continues to require creative solutions.

Overall Reflection

The core challenge has not been a lack of willingness, but capacity. The region is growing in both numbers and responsibility. Strengthening financial stability, deepening service training, and building sustainable structures remain ongoing priorities. Despite these challenges, unity, commitment, and steady Fellowship Development efforts continue to move NA Kenya forward.

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

The Narcotics Anonymous Kenya Region would like to share a few reflections that may be meaningful to other conference participants.

1. Growth Rooted in Simplicity

NA in Kenya continues to grow steadily across multiple counties. Many meetings operate in modest community spaces with limited resources, yet attendance and member commitment remain strong. The message of recovery is carrying further each year because members are willing to serve consistently, even when conditions are not ideal.

2. Strong Focus on Fellowship Development

The region has placed intentional emphasis on Learning Day events and service mentorship. These efforts have helped stabilize newer Areas and strengthen understanding of NA principles, service structure, and Consensus-Based Decision Making. Capacity-building remains a central priority.

3. Youth and Emerging Membership

Kenya has a relatively young population, and many new members are young adults. This presents both opportunity and responsibility. The region is learning how to balance enthusiasm with structured guidance, ensuring sustainability while preserving unity.

4. Commitment to Translation and Accessibility

Efforts toward local language accessibility are ongoing, with collaboration in translation work to make literature more widely understood. This is an important step in ensuring NA remains culturally accessible without compromising the integrity of the message.

5. Willingness to Collaborate

NA Kenya values connection with other regions and zones. Experience-sharing, mentorship, and participation in zonal and world-level discussions have strengthened local service. The region remains open to learning, partnership, and shared growth.

Closing Reflection

NA Kenya is still developing in many ways, but the foundation is strong: unity, willingness, and a clear focus on carrying the message. The region approaches the broader conference space with humility, gratitude, and readiness to contribute where possible while continuing to learn from the global fellowship.

A motion was approved for the accountability of this committee to also be done virtually, formalizing the success of this model.**

• **Virtual Workshops: A "Personal Stories Workshop" was requested and conducted virtually, serving different areas and overcoming geographical barriers.**

2. Modernization of Communication and Management

• **Adoption of the 132 Service: The ASCs successfully adopted the 132 extension system, a more centralized and professional technological solution for customer service.**

• **Use of Digital Reports: The ASCs are using digital reports. Although there is still a need for adherence, the initial implementation was an important step to modernize data collection.**

• **Centralization of Documents in Cloud: The complete reports of the servers are available through links to Google Drive ("cloud links on drive"). This ensures that all members have easy and centralized access to information before meetings, optimizing discussion time.**

3. Online Support and Structure

• **Webmaster Support: The Webmaster offers ongoing support to the region and committees, assisting with access to the official NA website in Brazil, manuals, bulletins, and minutes. A WhatsApp group was created to share useful links and facilitate access to these resources.**

• **Online Calendar: It was mentioned that there is already an official calendar of meetings on the RSCMinas website, avoiding the need to create new calendars and centralizing information.**

These examples demonstrate that technology has not been a fundamental tool to increase inclusion, optimize communication, modernize management, and expand the reach of services in the Minas Region.

The central point of discussion is the loss of \$956,129 recorded in the financial report of WCNA 38, finalized in March 2025. This negative result contrasts strongly with the expectation of a profit of almost a million dollars (\$995,897), representing a negative variation of 196% in relation to the budget.

This significant loss, added to the decision of 2023 to suspend WCNA's rotation policy outside of North America after 2024, intensifying debates on sustainability and the future model of our biggest event. As conversations in our region revolved around the need to reevaluate the format, the costs and the revenue sources of the convention to guarantee that it continues to be a beacon of hope and celebration of recovery for the newly arrived and long-term members, without compromising the financial stability of Narcóticos Anonímicos as a whole, and of our world convention.

Please describe the most significant challenge your region has faced since WSC 2023.

critical point raised was the inadequate management of the hybrid/virtual platform (HI). In summary, the most significant challenge for our region since WSC 2023 has been dealing with the unintended consequences of accelerated and disordered adoption of the hybrid model. The lack of a support structure, standardized training and guidelines based on collective consciousness transformed a promising tool into a great obstacle for unity and effective transmission of our message of recovery. Heated debates about how panels could be managed in the hybrid model, and the interaction between present and virtual participants, and the migration of servers from other areas and regions for our virtual service panel, without any consultation, endorsement or direction of the local structure to which the server physically belongs. This unilateral practice not only disregarded the autonomy and conscience of the areas of origin, but also overburdened our regional structure with responsibilities for which we were unprepared. The arrival of members of other communities" in our virtual environment, without a process of integration or communication between structures, symbolized the crisis, evidencing that the challenge of the Hybrid/Virtual transcended the sphere of the group and became a geographical and unifying problem.

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

As we reflect on recent challenges, such as the financial results of WCNA 38 and the troubled implementation of hybrid technologies, the fundamental truth becomes clear: our brotherhood is stronger when we walk together. Therefore, the most crucial information that I would like to share today is not a new problem, but a sincere appeal for a collaborative solution.

I would like to propose that we, as a conference, formally encourage our World Services to consult with the Regions and their Regional Delegates (DRs) more frequently and in depth, especially on sensitive and high-impact issues.

This applies directly to two critical areas:

1. **The Future of the World Convention (WCNA):** Decisions on the format, location, budget and sustainability of the WCNA should not be taken in isolation. The Regions have a valuable view on what is "possible and practical" in their communities. A more robust consultation can foresee financial, logistical and cultural challenges, guaranteeing that our world convention continues to be a unifying celebration event, and not a source of financial concern. Concepts need to be revisited with the decisions of the World Framework
2. **An implementation of Technology Services:** A crisis with hybrid platforms demonstrates that the implementation of new technologies without a constant dialogue with bases can generate chaos, disunite groups and compromise our traditions. World Services, in partnership with Regions, should lead the creation of good practice guidelines, training programs and clear guidelines. As Regions, on the other hand, we can provide feedback in real time on what works, the challenges faced and the specific needs of their communities, avoiding the most ineffective or prejudicial solutions. It is a practical application of our Second Concept, which affirms that the final responsibility is the authority for the services of NA repousam and conscience of brotherhood. Our Regional Delegates are the vital link in this chain. Utilizing them in a more proactive manner in strategic decisions will guarantee that the World Services will truly act as a reflex of the collective conscience that we represent.

Many Areas noted strong engagement around Informational Discussion Topics (IDTs), presentations from Region to Areas, and questions about how to better support local service bodies. Additional topics that sparked discussion included Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT), shortages of trusted servants, Area Service Committee scheduling and accessibility, and concerns about maintaining fidelity to NA's message in language and graphics. Financial matters-particularly spending plans, travel costs, and accommodations-also generated significant discussion, reflecting broader concerns about sustainability and participation in service.

Please describe the most significant challenge your region has faced since WSC 2023.

The most significant challenge faced by Areas over the last three years has been declining participation in service, particularly at the Area Service Committee and subcommittee levels. Many Areas reported difficulty engaging trusted servants, low GSR attendance, and a lack of mentorship to support members stepping into service roles. These challenges have been compounded by post-COVID shifts toward online meetings, reduced in-person attendance, and the need to balance accessibility with effective service delivery. Several Areas also identified financial and treasury transitions, convention-related challenges, and maintaining an atmosphere of recovery at the group level as ongoing concerns. Despite these difficulties, many Areas expressed cautious optimism, noting gradual improvement in participation and a renewed focus on rebuilding strong, supportive service structures.

Our region remains committed to strengthening unity, improving service delivery, and embracing thoughtful innovation to better support our fellowship. We are grateful for the opportunity to serve, to learn from other regions, and to collaborate in carrying the NA message more effectively together.

PR conducts poster drives and works with community service organizations & outside agencies. Our region and some of our areas have professionally made signage, both table-top and stand-alone, and attend a number of resource and health fairs and overdose/addiction awareness events. There is always a lot of discussion about DRT/MAT. Many wish the World Board would take a position and state that our Fellowship's policy is that members who are

taking non-essential, mood-altering, addictive drugs are not "clean". They are members and welcome to attend, but some forms of service, speaking, and sponsoring are reserved for our members who are "clean".

Please describe the most significant challenge your region has faced since WSC 2023.

Probably the most significant challenge facing our region has been the rising cost of services - in particular, providing liability insurance coverage for NA meetings & events throughout the region and operation of our regional "helpline" phone service. Our region is looking into the use of technology to significantly reduce the cost associated with phone line services for both the region and its areas.

The most significant challenge faced by one area is handling the large number of newcomers from treatment facilities & recovery houses at meetings - averaging 100-200 people at many meetings. This area has lost the use of several venues because of the impact these numbers have on the facilities. When they've attempted to place a limit on the number of attendees (as directed by the venues fire code capacity), the meetings end up primarily newcomers arriving early in the treatment vans, leaving experienced members unable to attend.

Another area had an apex predator attending meetings. This individual single-handedly did more damage than anything they had ever experienced - selling drugs in meetings and roping newcomers into human trafficking. Local treatment centers stopped bringing their clients to NA because of this individual's presence. Meetings that used to average 45-50 people are now down to 2-5 attendees. When our founding member set our policy that we don't exclude or ban anyone from our meetings, they could not have imagined what our society has devolved into. The time has come to re-examine our policy that everyone is welcome. It's one of the beautiful things about virtual meetings. If people enter a meeting for the purpose of disrupting it, we throw them out.

Another challenge is that many banks seem baffled by our annual turnover of trusted servants and how to manage changing signatories.

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

We were very glad to see the information pamphlet, "Staying Clean in Isolation" updated. We would like to see other existing IP's updated as it's embarrassing to hold literature study meetings and have outdated information in the IP's.

Many do not want our Worldwide Fellowship to alter our literature to pacify populations who comprise a very small percentage of our membership, such as LGBTQ or atheist/agnostic members. Perhaps an IP or booklet could be written to address the concerns of such members, but we do not want to see our existing, foundational recovery literature altered.

Our region has been present at numerous music festivals and events, including Pol'and'Rock Festival, Slot Art Festival, and the Antoniów Festival. We also conducted presentations for professionals, including a session at the University of Warsaw for psychology students, as well as trainings for court probation officers in Toruń and Kraków. Additionally, we cooperated with the Polish Armed Forces - specifically the Military Police - by delivering a presentation at their invitation.

We see consensus as a more spiritual and inclusive process, one that is better aligned with our values.**

Service Delivery & Best Practices

Are fellowship development (FD) or outreach efforts provided within your region?
Yes, Context:
In 2020, a working group dedicated to the fellowship development was established. Very quickly, the group focused on development activities without first establishing a clear operating method, which led to several difficulties. After approximately two years,

and in the absence of established guidelines, we decided to attach the RFD to the Regional Public Relations Subcommittee (RPRS).

However, due to its growth, the RPRS requested after a few months that development no longer fall under its mandate. Trust in the development team was already fragile, notably because the individuals in office had repeatedly violated regional guidelines. The lack of a precise framework, the instability of the fellowship development's position within the service structure, and the novelty of the mandate all contributed to diminishing the RSC's confidence in the individuals.

As a result, a consensus was reached: development will become a fully-fledged subcommittee, reporting directly to the CSR.

In 2023-2024, the Regional Fellowship Development Subcommittee (RFDS) went through a period of reflection and reassessment, marked by a need for clarity regarding its vision,

its purpose, and its practices, as well as by the absence of fully defined guiding principles and guidelines. A clarification and realignment process has just been completed.

The adoption of a vision, a mission, values, guiding principles and guidelines is one of the cornerstones of this process!

Here is the vision that was adopted:

All efforts of Narcotics Anonymous are inspired by the primary purpose of our groups. On this common ground, we remain committed.

Our vision is that one day all members will have access to the knowledge, values, and experiences of the Fellowship, in order to foster, strengthen, and anchor a deep sense of belonging. We pool our resources and strengths so that as many of us as possible may be inspired by our primary purpose and by the power of unity in Narcotics Anonymous.

The RFDS vision is directly inspired by our First Tradition, which reminds us that unity and our sense of belonging are essential to our personal and collective recovery. It seeks to ensure that every member has access to what nurtures connection to the WE: the knowledge, values, experiences, and understanding of the service structure - the very force that has enabled Narcotics Anonymous to grow throughout the world.

With this vision, a mission as well as values and guiding principles were adopted.

During the reorganization process, the Development Subcommittee was temporarily suspended, and since the completion of the work last November, the officer positions of this subcommittee have remained vacant.

Describe what kind of planning your region and/or its areas utilize.

At the regional level, every 3 years we organize a strategic planning day where all members are invited to participate, and everyone has the opportunity to speak during the workshops.

The three priorities of our last regional strategic plan were:

1. **Strengthening unity and fostering a welcoming atmosphere**
2. **Making service more attractive and engaging**
3. **Realigning and reactivating the Fellowship Development Subcommittee, putting it back on track with a clearer direction**

It is also responsible for maintaining the regional website, which was recently redesigned. In addition, the committee manages service email accounts and system updates, and provides technical support to trusted servants.**

- **The creation of a 24-page professional brochure designed for frontline workers and institutional stakeholders who work with individuals struggling with addiction.**
- **Securing digital billboard visibility in the six largest cities in Canada - a coast-to-coast presence that was shared with the various regions of the Canadian Assembly.**
- **Television advertisements and other strategic media placements.**

These initiatives clearly reflect our commitment to increasing public understanding of Narcotics Anonymous and supporting groups in carrying the message of hope.

The Unity Days 2025-2026, held continuously for 11-12 days, 24 hours a day, celebrated "Carrying a Message of Hope". From the December 23 to January 3 th Participants from France, Switzerland, Belgium, Indian Ocean, Ireland, Dominican Republic, Costa Rica, Cuba, Great Britain, United States, Vietnam, Bahamas, Israel, Latvia, Netherlands, Japan, and Canada joined. The event welcomed 80 newcomers, featured 117 speakers, and included 272 hours of meetings and activities. Key committees involved were H&I Quebec, the NA Helpline, and the Regional Service Committee, addressing service structure, consensus processes, and conduct issues.

The Gifts of Service Roundtable, held in 2025, aimed to inspire enthusiasm for service, encourage replication across Areas, and foster a renewed appreciation and perception of service. The one-day event brought together 40-50 members representing four decades of service, at both group and regional levels, who shared personal and collective experiences through small-group workshops and large-group feedback sessions. Based on insights from the roundtable, the QRSCNA is developing practical tools to make service more appealing. Overall, the roundtable strengthened participation, reignited service enthusiasm, and highlighted the vital role of service in individual recovery, spiritual growth, group health, and the vitality of the Fellowship.

There is a constant need to strengthen the Public Information (PI) and Hospitals and Institutions (H and I) subcommittees so that Dominican society and health institutions recognize NA as a viable resource, distinct from other programs, thus confronting the social stigma surrounding addiction in the country. The main challenge is revitalizing local service to ensure that, despite technological and economic changes, addicts still suffering in any corner of the Dominican Republic can find open meetings and available literature. There is difficulty in funding delegate participation in zonal forums or the WSC. Regional subcommittees (PI, H and I) in some areas are operating at half capacity or are inactive. Area Service Meetings (ASCs) have low attendance, weakening communication with the Region.

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

disconnect has developed where groups operate in isolation. As the flow of money and volunteers to the Region decreases, the group focuses only on its own survival (paying rent, coffee). When groups fail to attract new members to service, the burden falls on the same "long-standing volunteers." Older volunteers burn out and retire; new members see service as a heavy and stressful burden rather than a vital part of their recovery. This creates a leadership vacuum that hinders turnover (the 4th Tradition at risk). There is a

real difficulty in conveying that service is a tool for developing the fellowship. Without service training, new members don't feel called to get involved in regional subcommittees (like PI or H and I), which reduces NA's visibility in Dominican society and, consequently, results in fewer new members joining the groups. The Quisqueyan Region faces the challenge today of re-engaging members with service. It's not just about money; it's the lack of "willingness" to take the message beyond the group's doorstep. If new members don't join the groups, the message becomes recycled.

Service Delivery & Best Practices

Are fellowship development (FD) or outreach efforts provided within your region?
Yes, Currently, Fellowship Development (FD) and Outreach are carried out through the Strategic Development Plan (SDP) of the SOSONA-India. The aim is to carry the message of hope by:

1. **Reaching out to communities**
2. **Connecting with loner groups and organizations**
3. **Conveying the message of NA to governing heads of state and central departments, as well as NGOs, as part of Public Relations efforts**

India is geographically divided into four zones: North, East, West, and South. Each zone conducts one or two FD projects at a time, and the duration of a single FD project is typically 6 to 8 months. Through these initiatives, members and communities can

directly benefit from SOSONA-supported FD activities such as workshops, learning days, interactive sessions, LTC, LDS, entertainment programs, events, Public Relations (PR), Hospitals & Institutions (H&I), media outreach, and phonenumber services. At present, we are also developing a Fellowship Development Guideline for our region. The purpose is to help carry out FD efforts in a more strategic, structured, and accountable manner.

Describe what kind of planning your region and/or its areas utilize.

The Fellowship Development Plan/Service Request is invited from different areas. Based on the proposals received, along with a bidding process and the availability of funds, we select 2-4 FD requests every six months. The selected areas are then supported and followed up during the following six months. Funds are allocated to the respective areas to carry out their Fellowship Development efforts, and guidance is provided throughout the process. This approach allows members at the area level to directly participate in and gain practical experience with Fellowship Development initiatives.

If you have had any particular successes with utilizing technology in new ways within your region and/or areas, please share them. One of our areas has recently started using AI technology to assist with literature translation into Hindi. This initiative is helping members translate recovery literature more efficiently while maintaining clarity and accessibility for Hindi-speaking members.

Please describe the different types of public relations efforts (PR/PI) carried out in your region.

Some of the common PR efforts carried out in our region include:

1. Outreach to Treatment Centers and Institutions

Members coordinate with rehabilitation centers, hospitals, and other facilities to introduce NA and provide information about meetings and recovery support. This is often done in cooperation with H&I services.

2. Interaction with Government and Public Bodies

PR trusted servants sometimes communicate with state and central government departments, social welfare offices, and local authorities to share information about NA and how it supports recovery in the community.

3. Collaboration with NGOs and Community Organizations

We engage with NGOs and community-based organizations working in addiction recovery, health, and social welfare. These interactions help build understanding about the NA program and encourage referrals to NA meetings.

4. Public Awareness Activities

Areas and regions organize public awareness programs such as information stalls, open meetings, recovery workshops, learning days, and seminars to explain the NA program and how people can access help.

5. Media and Digital Communication

Some areas use local media, social media platforms, and phonline services to provide accurate information about NA meetings and recovery resources. These platforms help addicts and their families find support more easily.

6. Posters, Banners, and Helpline Visibility

Many areas also carry out poster and banner campaigns in public places such as hospitals, police stations, community centers, and other visible locations. These materials usually display the NA helpline number and basic information so that addicts or their families can easily reach out for help.

7. Community-Based Events

PR committees sometimes participate in health awareness events, recovery-related gatherings, or community programs where NA information can be shared respectfully and in line with NA traditions.

What subject generated the most interest and discussion in your region this cycle?

In the SOSONA - India region, the most interest and discussion during the past conference cycle centered around fellowship development, service structure, and unity within the fellowship.

Much of the discussion focused on strengthening area-level participation in service, improving communication between groups, areas, and the regional body, and encouraging members to become more involved in service responsibilities. There was also considerable interest in developing clearer processes and guidelines for Fellowship Development (FD) initiatives so that projects can be carried out more strategically and with better accountability.

Please describe the most significant challenge your region has faced since WSC 2023.

One of the most significant challenges faced since the World Service Conference 2023 has been maintaining unity and effective communication across a geographically large and diverse fellowship.

Our region includes multiple areas with different levels of service experience, resources, and local challenges. Because of this diversity, maintaining consistent participation in regional service, ensuring transparent communication, and supporting developing areas has sometimes been difficult. Some areas are still building strong service structures and trusted servant participation, which can slow decision making and implementation of regional initiatives.

Another challenge has been the process of area splitting and restructuring as the fellowship continues to grow in different parts of the region. While this growth is positive, it sometimes brings questions related to service boundaries, participation, and maintaining cooperation between newly formed and existing areas.

Additionally, there have been discussions regarding seating requests and representation at regional meetings, as areas grow and more members become involved in service.

Ensuring fair participation and maintaining an effective decision-making process has required ongoing dialogue and adjustments within the service structure.

Are fellowship development (FD) or outreach efforts provided within your region?
Yes, From October 2024 to October 2025, the FD Sub-Committee concentrated on strengthening fellowship structures, supporting struggling meetings, and assisting the growth of new groups.
This included the opening of 8 new in-person NA meetings, while also assisting 4 online groups as they moved towards becoming self-supporting and autonomous NA groups.
Progress was made on finalizing the Online ASC, providing ongoing guidance through the FD WhatsApp group, and rebuilding structures in regions such as the Eastern Cape.

Policy development was also prioritized, with FD drafting a proposal to amend the Members Safety and Wellbeing policy under Unity Ad Hoc.

The sub-committee helped coordinate the online streaming of SARCNA 2025 as well as serving as the Health & Safety Chair, while also contributing to the online H&I project. FD also coordinated several online NA speaker jams and workshops.

The remote sponsorship project continued to grow steadily, linking members in outlying areas with sponsors, and FD has encouraged greater support from groups and service representatives to help build a bigger NA footprint in outlying and rural cities, as well as digitally online.

Collectively, these efforts highlight FD's active involvement in policy shaping, meeting support and carrying the message across both established and developing communities.

Describe what kind of planning your region and/or its areas utilize.

1. Helping new Narcotics Anonymous groups open new meetings in outlying and rural cities and towns.
2. Helping struggling Narcotics Anonymous groups keep the doors open and outlying and rural cities and towns.

2. Ads

Social media is a pay to play arena, if you aren't paying you aren't playing. Your page's posts won't be seen by the people who need it most unless you pay for ads. Even when your page has 10,000

likes less than 5% of your audience will see your post people will see the posts unless you promote them. Social media algorithms do this so that we have to pay for ads.

Region should allocate a budget of R500.00-R1000.00 per month to Facebook ads, this can be adjusted according to the time of year, and more can be used over the three month period

surrounding Drug Awareness Month, as well the period surround December Holidays and January.

o Targeting

o When setting up ads for your region keep in mind that everyone has the potential to be an addict or know an addict, so we don't have to fine tune target the audience beyond the area.

o Region should only target areas that have an existing fellowship, and exclude areas that don't have any real base there, UNLESS there has been a request for help to grow meetings in the area.

o Region should target everyone in these areas between the ages of 18 and 65 - this could reach the still suffering addict, as well as friends and family members, key community members, and department members who we are trying to build relationships with. If they see the brand, it becomes recognizable and the first form of contact from us doesn't have to feel unfamiliar, they could know about us because of social media

- o As well as people who like specific music linked to the party lifestyle, and any other targeting criteria who might help us reach the still suffering addict directly
- o Choose your areas and see if the reach is too far or not far enough on the map and adjust accordingly
- o Promoting Posts
- o Posts should all be promoted for a minimum of 4 days at R100 per post. Some posts may be promoted for longer with higher budgets
- o Promoting the Page
- o Likes aren't as important as how many people we reach, so promoting the page isn't as important as promoting the content and the website. If your budget doesn't allow for it then don't worry about it. Who likes your page can also break anonymity so we should rather work at promoting posts
- o Promoting the Website
- o When promoting the website, as our number one goal is to get people to a meeting, using the meeting URL. This will obviously be changed according to the area we are promoting when it is not a national ad or promotion
- o Promoting meetings in an area
- o We promote meetings this week in add area here. This is something that we don't target at the whole of South Africa area, we downscale it to a smaller area within an Area, such as Soweto or Roodepoort in Johannesburg.

3. Protecting Anonymity

We can't disable tagging because that interferes with our reach, and often people might tag someone who is working on something that requires the assistance of NA. But what we can do is hide all public comments made by members to protect their anonymity, this means only their friends will see their comments. No images of members will ever be shared, and no members posts will be shared to the page.

4. NA Events

No NA events should be shared on a public social media platform of any kind, no online Zoom meeting links with video shares available. This is to protect anonymity.

5. Answering Messages

We do not give advice, we rather suggest people attend their nearest meeting and share a link to the meetings in that area. When it comes to anything which is not in the public information umbrella of NA

we need to reaffirm that we are only here to offer direction to the nearest meeting and cannot give any medical or personal advice. Always direct them to the phoneline or WhatsApp line for more assistance.

Are fellowship development (FD) or outreach efforts provided within your region?
Yes, As a part of our initial strategic plan, we created a project based fellowship development team that visited more than half of our constituent Areas, with a goal to visit the others this year. Since this was a new project, we primarily endeavored to make Regional trusted servants visible and available. We met with some success in that Area trusted servants felt seen and heard, and appreciated our outreach efforts.

Describe what kind of planning your region and/or its areas utilize.
Last year, we initiated strategic planning for the first time. We used a model that begins with scanning, where information is gathered through reports, surveys, and data

collected at our Regional Assembly. Participants then brainstormed what is working, what is not working, and challenges exist. Similar concerns were grouped and prioritized into a small number of key issues. Thereafter, the group developed one clear, SMART goal per issue, defining the desired outcome rather than the steps to achieve it. Next, detailed action plans were created that outlined specific deliverables, responsible leaders, timelines, budgets, and evaluation points. Progress was then monitored regularly, results were evaluated, and they have been fed back into the RSC.

If you have had any particular successes with utilizing technology in new ways within your region and/or areas, please share them. Although our RSC is technically "in-person", it is actually hybrid and most participants attend virtually. Last year, we operated a pilot program for YAP in one of our outlying Areas that lacked a subcommittee to support a phone line. This project went well, and we are considering implementing YAP for use with the Region itself.

Please describe the different types of public relations efforts (PR/PI) carried out in your region. Our Regional PR Committee does tabling at public events and booth sittings at professional conferences. These include the Evolution of Psychotherapy, and other conferences of medical professional and mental health professionals. We also conduct virtual parole presentation/meetings twice per week, attended by about 100 parolees at each meeting. In addition to the Parole Department, we also maintain and nurture relationships with L.A. Out of 39 ASCs who are members of our RSC only around 12 regularly attend Region (i.e. around 30%) and the feed back we are getting from Areas, suggest that only around 20% of GSRs regularly attend ASCs. This suggests that only 6% of the groups are in contact with Region and regularly receive information from it.

This suggests that over 90% of our groups are not properly connected to the rest of NA structure.

We have brought the above to the body and have asked for creative ideas to improve this situation.

What additional information would you like to share with other conference participants?

When we first started the Basic Text Audio (6th Edition UK Readers Version) it's stated intention was to be used within the UK prison system. We have now had multiple correspondence from members with different types of disability and also those who can not read, who have shared how beneficial the audio literature have been to their recovery. We have encountered a problem with delivering literature to foreign countries. Our region includes several foreign states. With some of them, Russia has simplified customs procedures, making the delivery of literature unproblematic. However, three other countries present more challenges. Essentially, shipping goods to these countries requires customs formalities. In two of these countries-Uzbekistan and Azerbaijan-there is also a risk during customs clearance that the authorities may inspect the literature and prohibit its importation because they are particularly sensitive about references to religious and related topics.

Delivery to Georgia is complicated by high transportation costs.

At this moment, intermediary companies have been found which deliver literature using their connections, but this does not constitute official shipments.

Another point concerns servicing these countries as well. Not all parts of Georgia belong to our region. There are actually Georgian and Russian groups there. The Russians joined one of our local areas. There is complex interaction between the dependent Russian-speaking population and the local Georgian community.

Furthermore, Uzbekistan and Azerbaijan will need either future deliveries or nearby production of literature in their own languages. Shipping from Europe appears very expensive, while producing literature within the RFZ territory in another language could also be challenging.
